

Joint Ventures:

Building and Grounds and the Finance Ministry have once again teamed up to put a bit of polish on Culdee. Lonnie McKenzie and Richard Blue have planned a list of tasks, both indoors and outdoors, that will be worked on throughout the year that were discussed at the March Finance Ministry meeting. Some jobs will need to be bid out; there may be opportunities for tax write-offs for those able to provide materials or labor, and some tasks will require plain old elbow grease. There will be opportunities coming for everyone to offer support physically, financially and/or through a word of encouragement, which makes work less like work. Please stay tuned and hopefully offer assistance as you are able.

Financial Status:

Thank you for your support of Culdee! Culdee continues to be in good shape overall. The Financial Report for February 2022 showed contributions were \$263.55 over the monthly budget needs and expenses for the month were \$6,420,33 under budget. This is good news.

Now for Paul Harvey's "the rest of the story". If Culdee had to pay a pastor at the amount budgeted for 2022, then another \$7,122.14 would need to be added to the monthly expenses. Please understand that once a pastor is engaged and the congregation votes on the pastor's Terms of Call, then that monthly amount is likely to change. It could go higher or lower, but it will likely change.

Even with the uncertainty facing the world, Culdee's investments and savings continue to grow. Savings and CDs at Truist and Live Oak Banks have gained \$99.81 of interest included in the balance of \$188,183.24 through February. January and February earnings under Stifel's management total \$538.19 included in the balance of \$342,422.08.

Additional Tidbits:

Sandhills Accounting Services, the company engaged to oversee Culdee's financial documentation and non-profit status, has new owners. Culdee appreciates the professional expertise and support from Pat Shenkle who retired and looks forward to developing a relationship with the new owners, Cherelle and Derrick James. Thankfully Culdee's direct accountant, Saundra Lankford, will remain working with the church.


The church van which was hit by a deer in December has finally made it to its repair shop appointment and should soon be back to its normal condition soon and be ready for new adventures.


