- Motion Approved....As directed by our Presbyterian policy of regularly reviewing church rolls and to support continuing efforts to fully reopen all our church services and programs, a letter will be sent to all active and inactive members to give each person an opportunity to share your wishes in regard to your participation in the life of Culdee Church. **Please prayerfully read the letter and respond as soon as possible using the self-addressed, stamped envelope that will be provided with the letter.
- Motion Approved.....The REACH Service will resume on the first Sunday in August. It will be held at 9:00 a.m. and the Traditional Service will be held at 10:30 a.m.
- The Session gave the Worship Ministry its blessings to go forward with finding a minister to hold Revival in September.
- The Session approved the list of guest speakers in our pulpit during July.




Culdee's "Cook's" Cookbook Swap

Meeting Schedule:

The Finance Ministry meets in the Session Room at 4:30 following its regular schedule of the second Sunday of the month. The Session meeting follows at 6:00 in the Fellowship Hall. Church members are welcome to attend. Any changes to meeting times will be listed in the bulletin.

Financial Status:

The attached Sandhills Accounting Services May 2021 Financial Report shows that the church is holding steady financially. Currently there are 10.29 months of reserve funds available, 6 months of which are for emergencies.

At the April Session meeting, the Session approved finishing the following repairs to the manse:

- 1. Restoring the heat and exhaust vent to the master bathroom.
- 2. Properly replace the 1/4" thick board portion of the ceiling above the shower in master bath.
- 3. Assess and repair the mold still on the remaining wall near the basement fireplace.

US HOW TO

- 4. Replace sheetrock and trim and paint the bedroom in the basement.
- 5. Add a toilet to the partial bath in the basement making it a full bath.

The Finance Ministry has offered to assist Building and Grounds with gathering bids from licensed contractors.

Lightning Strike & Insurance Update:

Currently the claim is closed with all known repairs having been made.


FAMILY PROMISE
