From the Pastor's Desk...

- **Douglas Meeks:** I invite you to join us in the Fellowship Hall during Sunday School on Sunday, August 10. Douglas Meeks, who just returned from a mission trip, will be sharing with us some of his experiences and how God worked through him and the rest of the team...and how God is continues to move in his life.
- **REVIEW OF 2014 PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (USA) GENERAL ASSEMBLY:** On Wednesday, July 16, a group of about 60 gathered in the Fellowship Hall to discuss the actions and decisions of the recent General Assembly. While I attempted to record the session for those unable to attend, the recording did not turn out...so I want to offer a brief synopsis of what we covered.

First, the General Assembly is a national gathering of commissioners from the 172 Presbyteries that make up the Presbyterian Church (USA). This group typically meets every two years...and this year met in Detroit, MI. There were about 654 voting commissioners, with as near to equal numbers as possible between clergy and elders. Our Presbytery, Presbytery of Coastal Carolina, sent 4 clergy and 4 elder commissioners. Over the course of one week this body addressed roughly 800 items of business.

While the General Assembly covered a huge amount of business, there were two items that seem to have caught the attention...and concern...of many people sitting in the pews of Presbyterian Churches across the country. These two "hot button" items are divestment and same gender marriage. In the space below I want to try and briefly explain what was decided and what does it mean for the church. I will also outline where the Session of Culdee Presbyterian Church is in their response to these, and other, issues. Now...my goal is not to defend these actions but to explain them and to address some concerns that have been raised by some folks here as well as in the media. So...here we go!

The first issue is divestment. While there is a lot of anger related to this action of the General Assembly, the assembly was also clear that they did not vote to divest from Israel but from 3 companies doing business in Israel whose products are used for non-peaceful purposes. The three companies are Caterpillar (whose bulldozers are used in the destruction of homes in Palestinian and for clearing land of fruit and olive tree groves); Hewlett-Packard (whose electronic systems are used at checkpoints and whose communications systems support the naval blockade of the Gaza Strip); and Motorola Solutions (who provide military communications and surveillance systems in Israeli settlements on disputed lands). In reality this vote is more symbolic due to our relatively small holdings in these companies. One area I feel the assembly (or denomination) has failed is to emphasize the ways in which we are continuing to invest in companies doing business in Israel...as well as with the Israeli and Palestinian people themselves. While we can certainly agree or disagree with this decision, we should all continue to pray for peace within that region...something this denomination has been committed to for years.

The second controversial issue was related to same gender marriage. On this topic, two items were passed.

1. First, the General Assembly approved an Authoritative Interpretation (an interpretation of the Constitution of the PC (USA) that is binding on all councils of the church) which stated that grants discretion to pastors in determining whether or not to conduct same-gender marriages in states where such marriages are legal. It also grants sessions the discretion to allow church property to be used for such ceremonies. Being an Authoritative Interpretation this ruling is effective immediately.
2. Second, the General Assembly approved an amendment to the Book of Order that would redefine marriage from being “between a man and a woman” to being between “two people, traditionally a man and a woman.” This approved amendment does not change anything yet, but goes to each of the 172 Presbyteries for a vote. If a majority of Presbyteries approve it then the Book of Order will be changed accordingly.

Both the Authoritative Interpretation and the proposed change to the Book of Order are careful to note that neither can compel a pastor to perform, nor a Session to authorize the use of church property for, a marriage service they feel is contrary to their understanding of scripture.

So, that is what the General Assembly did...what is your Session doing? We are seeking to plot a course of action that is proactive and prayerfully guided. We began our discussion of these issues at our last Session meeting and will continue to do so. We are very concerned that some of these decisions are a severe break with scripture but also feel we need to refrain from reacting either too quickly or with too much delay. Here are some things I can tell you from our Session meeting:

- We are committed to the standards God has given us in His word. There is no room for compromise on this. To that end, we affirmed our current policy/practice regarding marriages and are committed to being guided by the current Book of Order.
- We are drafting a letter of response that, once approved, will be distributed among the churches within the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina as well as the staff of the Presbytery.
- We are seeking to engage other churches (and for myself, pastors) in the topic of what it means to live/minister within this denomination when there is so much on which we disagree.
- Several members of the congregation have raised the issue of whether or not we should withhold our giving to the denomination. This is an issue the Session takes very seriously. We have held off on our last quarterly payment while we prayerfully consider the options in front of us and whether or not this step would allow us to engage the Presbytery leadership, and whoever else might be helpful, in a conversation about our concerns over the recent moves away from Biblical standards.
- We will also seek churches that hold similar views/concerns as ours in an effort to engage in mutually supportive mission/ministry programs.

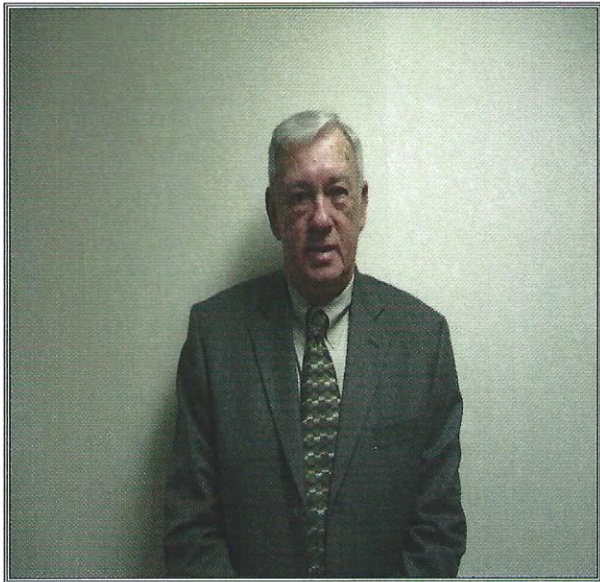
What can you do?

- Pray for the Session—that they would be given wisdom and discernment
- Pray for the PCUSA—that God would keep us faithful to His will & Word
- Pray for the purity, peace and unity of Culdee Presbyterian Church
- Ask questions/share thoughts
 - We can no longer afford to run from these issues!
- Trust God...He is MUCH bigger than any GA decision!
