

FINANCE MINISTRY NEWS

As I approach my last month as an Elder of Culdee Presbyterian Church, I have spent a lot of time contemplating my service to this church. When I was asked to serve, I was humbled and overwhelmed that I was even considered for such an important role. Being an Elder is a 'great' responsibility. I think 'great' is such an appropriate word here because it denotes size as well as importance. From my first weeks of Elder training with Pastor Joe to my first year as a rookie Elder, there was much to learn about our church and the duties of being an Elder. When I reflect on my service, I am very proud of some accomplishments yet discouraged that I was not better at other duties. Ultimately, God has provided each of us with gifts that we use to the best of our abilities.

Serving on the Finance Ministry can be a thankless job within the church. We are routinely put in a position to stop or slow down some very good ideas or initiatives. Ask anyone who serves in this ministry and they will tell you how difficult these decisions or recommendations to the Session can be. Our goal is to never stand in the way of our faith and the mission of our church, but to act responsibly with the resources God has provided. The Finance Ministry has submitted an operating budget for 2016 to the Session. With some modifications, it has been approved by the Session and will be presented to the membership at our annual business meeting in December.

The Finance Ministry would like to continue to emphasize some key points about our budget. The operating budget consists of two parts - income and expenses. Income is primarily derived from tithes and offerings. Expenses are fairly self explanatory, but include salaries, utilities, supplies, missions, etc. All the expenses combined form the yearly spending plan for the church. To formulate our annual operating budget, we base the income from the previous years income. For example, the 2015 Budget was based on the income from 2014. Likewise, the 2016 Budget is based on the income from 2015. Because the income levels from tithes and offerings has fallen far short of our 2015 Budget, we have reduced our 2016 Budget by over \$14000. Making budget cuts is never easy but is necessary when the income of the church is below projected levels. As a side note, the ministries of the church have done an outstanding job of reducing spending for 2016. Hopefully that will help prevent us from using our savings for operating expenses for the remainder of the year.

The final part of the church finances that needs to be addressed is our designated accounts. As most of you know, we have some formal designated accounts where people make contributions. These include the Cemetery Fund, The Doris Moore Scholarship Fund, and The Sara Ann Fortune Fund. We also have some less formal designated accounts. These are also funds that people contribute money towards for a specific purpose, such as paving, paint & wallpaper, and youth activities. All these accounts are beneficial to our church. However, none of the funds contributed to these accounts can be used to operate our church on a daily basis. We do not want to discourage anyone from donating to these funds or accounts, but we do need to emphasize the importance of tithes and offerings to support all the operations of our church.

CULDEE ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE NEWS

Greetings, and Merry Christmas from the Endowment Fund Committee. We have been quite busy since our last update to you in the November newsletter, which reflected news from our October 4, 2015 meeting. While our next meeting was scheduled for 1/3/2016, the Endowment Fund Committee has had the pleasure of discussion and fellowship on three additional occasions: 10/19, 10/26, and 11/17.

After being given Session approval to invest particular Culdee Church funds, as well as after lengthy research and collaboration with a variety of other groups and individuals, the Endowment Fund Committee is happy to announce that we have moved forward with investment of the funds entrusted in our care.

A motion carried unanimously to follow largely in the footsteps of Brownson Memorial Presbyterian Church, and invest at the present time, in a diverse group of funds at Vanguard. Likewise, the Committee unanimously agreed upon a specific investment of the \$30,000 maturing Culdee Church CD (and its \$15.36 interest), and an investment avenue for the generous \$10,000 matching Anonymous Benefactor gift designated for future paving of the parking lot. These two securities were invested November 12, 2015, in two different Vanguard accounts, with a total investment amount of \$40,015.36. As of the November 17 Endowment Fund Committee meeting, the new total balance of the two accounts was \$40,119.47, yielding a total earning of \$104.01 thus far.

While acknowledging the positive earnings the accounts have accrued in such a short period of time, the Endowment Fund Committee has maintained, and continues to maintain, a commitment to a sense of duty, integrity, and a cautious spirit in each Committee discussion and action in investing Culdee Church securities.

Highlighting some of the major points of investment discussion, the Endowment Fund Committee agreed: there will be two persons from the Committee (Tim Lea, Church Trustee and Dannie Jackson, Church Trustee), involved in each actual transaction investment of church funds entrusted to the Committee; to invest conservatively and wisely to the best of the Committee's ability; to maintain awareness of our changing world politics upon investment; and, to look to long term investments for viability and widespread growth.

In addition, during the November 17 meeting and upon Session approval for investment by the Endowment Fund Committee, Committee members unanimously agreed to move \$37,493.63 of the designated Doris Moore Scholarship Fund (while leaving the original account open with a balance of \$1,000), and \$5,000 designated and \$11,667.48 of Harvest Festival Fund, to the Committee for investment in a chosen Vanguard account, under a sub heading at Vanguard for each group fund. Hence, each Culdee account will maintain its individuality, with only the avenue of investment being moved, to a Vanguard account.

As always, we appreciate your continued support and welcome any questions you may have for us. In addition, we continue to be humbled and grateful for our opportunity to serve.

The next Endowment Fund Committee meeting will be held 01/03/2015 at 5:00 p.m.

Culdee Presbyterian Church Pastor Terms of Call Proposed Budget for 2016

G-2.0804 Terms of Call

The terms of call shall always meet or exceed any minimum requirement of the presbytery in effect when the call is made. The session shall review annually the minister's terms of call and shall propose for congregational action (G-1.0501) such changes as the session deems appropriate, provided that they meet the presbytery's minimum requirements. The call shall include participation in the benefits plan of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), including both pension and medical coverage, or any successor plan approved by the General Assembly.

G-1.05 MEETINGS OF THE CONGREGATION

G-1.0501 Annual and Special Meetings

The congregation shall hold an annual meeting and may hold special meetings as necessary, for any or all of the purposes appropriate for congregational consideration. The business to be transacted at special meetings shall be limited to items specifically listed in the call for the meeting.

All active members of the congregation present at either annual or special meetings are entitled to vote. Congregations shall provide by rule the quorum necessary to conduct business.

and adopt a budget and determine the distribution of the congregation's benevolences. It shall authorize offerings for Christian purposes and shall account for the proceeds of such In addition to those responsibilities described in G-3.0113, the session shall prepare offerings and their disbursement. It shall provide full information to the congregation concerning its decisions in such matters.

Those in charge of various congregational funds shall report at least annually to the session and more often as requested. Sessions may provide by rule for standard financial practices supervise his or her work or delegate that supervision to a board of deacons or trustees. The session shall elect a treasurer for such term as the session shall decide and shall of the congregation, but shall in no case fail to observe the following procedures:

- a. All offerings shall be counted and recorded by at least two duly appointed persons, or by one fidelity bonded person;
- shall be kept and shall be open to inspection by authorized church officers at reasonable b. Financial books and records adequate to reflect all financial transactions
- c. Periodic, and in no case less than annual, reports of all financial activities shall be made to the session or entity vested with financial oversight.
