

From the Pastor's Desk...

- Presbytery Offering: In the September Newsletter we shared with you a letter that we mailed to all of the churches in the Presbytery and to the Presbytery office. This month I want to share an additional action, and subsequent letter, that the session took at our September meeting. The letter on the facing page was sent to Bill Reinhold, General Presbyter of the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina. Please know that we, as a session, are committed to several things. First, we are committed to loving and welcoming all who come to worship and to be a part of our congregation...we must love with a radical/lavish type of love. Second, we are committed to the Presbyterian Church, (USA). We, along, with a lot of other churches in this denomination are frustrated and struggling with some recent GA decision, but we are committed to being active and
- engaged in the life of Presbytery even as we decide to withhold our giving at this time. We continue to ask you pray for the Presbyterian Church (USA), the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina, Culdee Presbyterian Church, and each member and person involved in our ministry. Our desire remains the same as it has always been...to be faithful servants to our Lord Jesus Christ. If you have any questions/concerns please do not hesitate to contact me or one of the members of Session.
- Worship CD's: Did you know that we make CD recordings of our 11:00 worship services and that the audio versions of the sermon are posted on line? If you miss a Sunday, be sure to pick up a CD from the table outside the church office. If you do not find the CD for the particular Sunday you are looking for please feel free to contact the church office. You may also go to www.timewithpj.blogspot.com and listen to the sermons as well. This is also a great way to share a particular sermon with someone you think it might help.
- Sunday School: Are you currently attending a Sunday School class? If so, I want to encourage you to invite someone to join you on Sunday mornings...seek to make it a habit each week to invite a friend. If not, let me take this opportunity to encourage you to come give it a try. We currently have a variety of options available to you so one of our classes should meet your needs. I encourage you to give it a try for 2 weeks and see where God is leading you. We look for to see you there!
- Recharge Bible Study: The Parables of Jesus...when Jesus taught he often used parables, an ancient tool many teachers have used to communicate important lessons. On Wednesday evenings we are exploring some of the best loved parables that Jesus shared in the hopes that we will not only know them and understand them but will also be guided in our lives of faith today. Join us Wednesday evenings at 6:00 in the Fellowship. See you there!
- Time: Mark your calendars for Saturday, November 1...Standard time begins. (Yes, I'm aware it technically begins Sunday morning, but changing your clocks on Saturday night before bed is much easier!) Be sure to set your clocks back 1 hour when you go to bed!!!!

We, the Session and the Pastor of Culdee Presbyterian Church, prayerfully send you this letter to share with you some of our concerns within the denomination and within the Presbytery as well as how we feel God is leading us to respond.

We recognize that this is a difficult and turbulent time within the Presbyterian Church, (USA) and the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina. We realize that a number of churches in our denomination have already left and many are either in process or considering such action. At the outset of this letter we want to once again reaffirm our commitment to this denomination/presbytery even as we express our concerns and take appropriate steps in response as we discern God leading us.

As mentioned in the letter we recently sent to you, and our sister churches within the Presbytery, we are greatly concerned and disappointed with several actions of the recent General Assembly. The Israeli/Palestinian issue is complicated. And while we wholeheartedly support efforts to promote peace in that region we question both the effectiveness and wisdom of divestment. We, like a lot of other Presbyterian churches, have members and family members employed with some of the companies from which we voted to divest and therefore struggle with this decision. We are also greatly dissatisfied with the decisions related to same gender marriage. These concerns were outlined more extensively in our earlier letter. While we expressed in that letter our response to General Assembly actions we felt expressing our additional concerns and responses should be handled in a more direct fashion.

Our struggles go beyond actions by General Assembly, but also included decisions and actions within our own bounds. For years we have tried to support Camp Monroe and the ministry they provide our children and youth. In recent years we have tried to respond to financial pleas to help offset their changes in funding on the Presbytery level. However, while we will continue to support our children and youth who attend summer camping programs we do not feel at this time that we can continue to provide further financial assistance beyond that. Not long ago a vote was taken to allow alcohol at certain 3rd party events on camp property. While we understand the policy and the guidelines it clearly spells out we feel this is not consistent with the ministry goals this Presbytery seeks to follow. We understand that the camp is facing financial shortfalls, but this is a reality that many churches face as well, but we hope we would never compromise our beliefs and ministry goals in order to make up a financial shortfall.

In light of shrinking income and budget woes that many of us are working to overcome we struggle to see the Presbytery making adequate adjustments in its programing and structure to meet this current financial landscape. After praying over this matter for the past two months we have come to the decision that we must withhold our shared mission support giving to Presbytery at this time.

We will continue to be in prayerful support of the Presbytery...its staff as well as the churches within its bounds...and will also look for ways we can be supportive and involved.

ROBERT TIMOTHY "TIM" LEA

Robert "Timothy" Lea is an eighth generation Moore County resident on his mother's side, Aljean Short Lea, and one of six children, all of whom have attended Culdee Presbyterian Church. Tim lives with his wife, Laine, on the farm in Eastwood where he grew up. They have two grown children, a son, Blake, and daughter, Brittany. He attended the Moore County public schools, graduated from Sandhills Community College and attended East Carolina University. Tim served his country as a United States Marine and was honorably discharged.

Tim serves as an Elder and Vice Chairman of the Finance Ministry. Previously he served Culdee as Elder, Chairman of the Pulpit Nominating Committee, Deacon and President of the Men's Club.

Tim is the founder, Chairman and CEO of Healthcare Systems Consulting, Incorporated. Tim also served on the Moore County Schools Blue Ribbon Facilities Committee, Vice Chairman of the Carthage Finance Corporation Board in development of Little River Golf Club, Moore County Board of Health and member of the Moore County Chamber of Commerce. He also served on the Sandhills Community College Foundation Board of Directors, the North Carolina Association of Community College Trustees Executive Board.

In his capacity as County Commissioner, Tim served as Vice President of the Triangle J Council of Governments Board and Chairman of the Heart of North Carolina MegaPark Board. He also served on the Research Triangle Regional Partnership Board, Moore County Partners in Progress Executive Board, Retired Seniors Volunteer Program (RSVP), and the Aging Advisory Council.


Hobbies: Tim enjoys raising Black Angus cattle, horseback riding, farming, gardening, motor cycle riding, water and boating activities.



Culdee Presbyterian Church - Over One Hundred Years of Service

Looking back at over one hundred years of Culdee's history, it gives a real sense of the struggles and accomplishments by the people of the community. There were times when only a handful of folks met in a building propped up by logs, to those times when many of our people would leave to start a new church. Culdee has been a witness to the love and power of Jesus Christ.

Four Presbyterian Churches within ten miles of Culdee received many of our people when they were organized. These were Manley in 1900; West End in 1912; Pinehurst Community in 1913 and Eureka in 1916. At times when large numbers would leave to attend one of these new churches, many would fear for the continued prosperity of Culdee.

MEMORIES OF- MAKING CHICKEN AND DUMPLINGS @ CULDEE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH BY: LINDA WHITESELL UPOLE

Let me set the scene – Years ago, Culdee had a small Fellowship Hall with a very small kitchen. There was not room enough to mix and roll out the dough like the ladies and men do in the present age.

All available families cooked the chickens, usually old hens in their own kitchens, mixed up the dough, rolled and dropped into large pots like large canners. Mama (Irene Whitesell) and Aunt Fannie Lea (Mama's sister) worked together at our house. We worked all day, making the dumplings along with cakes and pies. When the food was ready, we carried it to the old Fellowship Hall kitchen at the pre-determined time and served it up.

Some of the ladies sat together and laughed about the mess they had left in their own kitchen.
