SPIRITUAL GIFTS

ADMINISTRATION & LEADERSHIP – a gift that enables a believer to effectively initiate, plan, direct or manage a project. (1 Corinthians 12:28; Acts 14:23)

DISCERNMENT – a gift that allows a believer to sense God's will or purpose. (Romans 9:1, 1 Corinthians 2:9-16)

EVANGELISM – a gift that allows a believer to reach out, teach, demonstrate or live in a way that attracts non-believers to the Christian faith. (Ephesians 4:11, Acts 2:36-40)

FAITH – a gift that allows a believer to accept and trust God in life situations that one cannot see or know. (1 Thessalonians 1:8-10)

GIVING, STEWARDSHIP, ALMS – a gift that allows a believer to generously and unselfishly give gifts of time, talent and treasure out of a sense of God's blessing. (2 Corinthians 9:6-15)

HOSPITALITY – a gift that allows a believer to see the needs of others and meet those needs with shelter, food, or other nurturing activities. (Romans 12:13, Romans 16:23)

MERCY – a gift that allows a believer to empathize with others in physical, spiritual, emotional need and to reach out to those with need. (Matthew 25: 34-36)

PROPHESY – a gift that allows a believer to speak with clarity about sin, God's will, and the future. (Romans 12:6)

MISSIONARY, PASTOR, SHEPHERD – a gift that allows a believer the gifts and graces of spiritual leadership for individuals or groups. (1 Timothy 3—4)

TEACHING – a gift that allows a believer to give instructions about the Bible and faith issues so that others can understand. (1 Corinthians 12:28)

WISDOM – a gift that allows a believer to consider information, opinions and facts and to determine the best options in a given situation. (1 Corinthians 2:6-13)
