Background Information

This lesson describes a relationship Jesus had with a two women and their brother. In John it is evident that these were people that Jesus knew very well. He taught, healed and had friendships with people. Remember women were not important in those days, but two of this group were women.

Martha was busy doing all the preparations necessary for guests. Mary simply sat at Jesus' feet and listened to his teachings.
