God Keeps Doing New Things

How blessed is God! And what a blessing he is! He's the Father of our Master, Jesus Christ, and takes us to the high places of blessing in him. Long before he laid down earth's foundations, he had us in mind, had settled on us as the focus of his love, to be made whole and holy by his love. Long, long ago he decided to adopt us into his family through Jesus Christ. –Ephesians 1: 3-5a

In one of their comic strips, Calvin and Hobbes are talking about the New Year. Calvin says, "I'm getting disillusioned with these New Years. They don't seem very new at all. Each New Year is just like the old year. Here another year has gone by and everything's still the same. There's still pollution and war and stupidity and greed. Things haven't changed. I say what kind of future is this? I thought things were supposed to improve. I thought the future was supposed to be better."

Hobbes replies, "The problem with the future is that it keeps turning into the present."

Two workers were talking: "Did you know Jones has 30 years experience?" The other said, "No, he doesn't have 30 years experience; He has one year, 30 times." The future kept turning into the present for him. This is not God's will for us.

Check out what Paul writes to us---He had us in mind, had settled on us as the focus of his love, adopted into His family. It sounds like God does not want us to lead hum-drum lives, and God definitely doesn't want us to live the same year but with a different number at the end.

God says in Revelation 21:5: "See I am making everything new." He said practically the same thing through Isaiah the prophet, "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing" (Isaiah 43:18-19). But we have to be open to whatever new thing God is going to do.

Football changed in 1906 because the forward pass was then allowed. Before that, games tended to be low scoring because the guys were getting "3 yards and a cloud of dust." Most teams just stuck with the old way, but St. Louis University stated doing the "new thing" – passing. In the first season they outscored their opponents 402-11...

God's new things are always good because we can trust Him. Happy New Years! - Pastor Chris

TROOP 45 for BOYS


