'The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want.' -Psalm 23:1

There has been a lot of crisis in my extended life lately. Have you ever been there? The question is not, 'What do I do if...?' but 'What will I do when I am in crisis? The world is a broken place and God knows that better than anyone. Good things happen to bad people, and bad things happen to good people. But what do I do?

David can help us. I want to go back to those many years ago when this Psalm was written: Few people had any writings, few people could read, the only way people transmitted messages was oral. What that means is that the people had to use their minds—memorize (some rabbis memorized the whole Law) and imagination. So, when this Psalm was read 3,000 years ago, the people had a crystal-clear vision of what David was talking about.

Of course, we have the whole 'sheep are dumb' thing, but keep in mind that sheep are easily frightened and they cannot find food or water on their own(!) The people thought, 'If God is my shepherd then he's definitely got this.'

In Psalm 23 there are only three statements that are personal future tense: 'I shall not want,' 'I will fear no evil,' and 'I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.' Everything else is present tense, making them statements of confidence. David wrote from experience. Somewhere along the line, the Spirit helped David realize that there is a certain 'heart-posture' that is key to our living. Crisis? I will fear no evil. Lost job? I shall not be in want. Insecure and afraid? I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

'He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside the quiet waters, he restores my soul.' One is physical, one is psychological, and one is spiritual. In all three arenas, God meets us... in the present tense, as in, this is happening On their own, sheep will not lie down in green grass, they will not graze feely, and they don't go where there is calmness unless there is no friction within the flock. 'Ok, I can't find food and water, I don't know that green grass will give me respite, and I don't realize that it is better to drink from a calm stream.' Sounds like I am utterly, completely, without a doubt dependent on God. That can be our 'heart-posture' when life turns us upside down. David knew from experience.

Pleasingly, this reassurance prompted BCPD Chief Rodrigues to retain her long-held position as the guiding light required to take this charitable initiative to a successful conclusion within Matagorda County. Plus, she has recruited her officers and staff to assume key roles.

So, in anticipating that you (and those whom you might represent) are also eager to be an integral part of this countywide endeavor this year, we extend to you a cordial invitation to attend the critically important follow up meeting. It will be held on:

6:00 to 7:00 Pm, Thursday, June 6, in First Methodist Church's Chapel Parlor 5th and Ave. G in Bay City

The primary objective in FMC hosting this event is to identify and fill all pertinent tasks and duties. Such a 'shared' investment of the time, talent and resources required will ensure that the holiday food needs of an estimated 650 families are abundantly met.

Basically, the secondary goal is to have this event emerge as a model project which produces meaningful, need-based impacts in its distinct region of the State of Texas. In this regard it is abundantly clear that the more entities that contribute in some tangible way...the greater the divine spirit of the season will be felt throughout our area and the lighter the burden will be on any supporting group or groups.

So, we expect you will want to join us on the 6th. However, to give other parties the opportunity to become part of this unique food security project, as a coveted volunteer or donor, you are asked to bring a friend, neighbor or associate with you to this short, fast-moving (but essential) gathering. Preferably, this will be someone who is not fully aware of the food insecurity situation which exists within our county...but is likely to have a keen desire to help end or prevent hunger in our corner of the world.







TROOP 45 for BOYS


