

Letting Your Leaves Fall

Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, 14 I press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us. -Philippians 3: 13a-14

I sat on the bench outside the library, eating my tub of cottage cheese for my 'dinner.' It was still warm and even a little humid. Then the wind picked up, replacing warm air with chilly temps. Fall had arrived and I felt blessed to watch it happen.

In the autumn, trees listen to their Maker and begin shedding their leaves. The chlorophyll begins to 'leave' the leaves, making way for all the bright, deep colors people drive hours to see. May we remember that the deep reds, oranges, and yellow colors were inside the leaves all along; They just needed the chance to reveal themselves. What wonderful things are inside of you that God would love the opportunity to bring out? But first, the tree must prepare to let them go.

For the tree, letting go of its leaves is the healthiest thing for the tree to do. As the leaves fall, trees begin building a protective seal between the leaves and branches. The tree takes in as many nutrients as possible before it starts saying 'Goodbye' to the leaves that have fed it for two seasons. What if the tree decided not to let go of its leaves? Its Maker knows that the leaves would not survive the cold winter and would make the tree vulnerable to damage if they stayed. There would be no flourishing in the spring if it held onto its leaves. We could learn a lot from our tree friends. Are you holding onto, even grasping, for the decaying leaves in your life? Or maybe they have been piling up inside for a while. Just like the trees, holding onto old leaves can never do us any good.

The good news is that our Maker would love to help you get ready for the winter months. Ask Him to shine a light on any thoughts or circumstances you are holding onto. Ask Him for the strength to show your beautiful colors which were inside the whole time. God will always answer that prayer.


