NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR Fifth Sunday of Lent March 26, 2023

Over fifteen years ago, the Los Angeles Times reported that David Sun and John Tu sold 80% of their company, Kingston Technology Corporation. At the time, it was the world's largest manufacturer of computer memory products. The sale price was \$1.5 billion. The two men then decided to share their windfall with their employees. The average bonus payment their workers received was just over \$75,000. Sun summarized their decision: "To share our success with everybody is the most joy that we can have!

Orville was informed some years ago, that he had terminal cancer. He went home to cry, and wait for death. He and his wife wondered: should we keep this disease a secret? They prayed about it. The answer that came to them was to share the news. But not only to share, but to rejoice. Rejoice! How could anyone rejoice with a disease sentence hanging over their heads?

Well, they decided to host a big party. During the festivities, Orville called for everyone's attention. He broke the news to his guests, saying, "You may have wondered why I called you all together. 
