#### 2016 WAS AN EXCITING YEAR!

From RESET to Opening Doors to Healthy Women and Families, we've created innovative programs that are making a measurable difference in the lives of women in Sacramento. Here is a look back at 2016 and what we are working on in 2017.

Our mission is to assist women who have been commercially sexually exploited



#### WE SERVED 290 WOMEN AT OUR CENTER FOR WOMEN.

Including, 59 RESET prostitution diversion program graduates and 19 Opening Doors anti-trafficking program participants. Last year, less than 3% of RESET graduates re-offended and 42% of Opening Doors participants obtained a job, moved into permanent housing, or enrolled in school.

## through survivor led peer support and harm reduction services



IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE CARES FOUNDATION, OUR STAFF OF 5 PEER MENTORS PROVIDED HIV EDUCATION AND MADE TESTING AVAILABLE TO 106 WOMEN. WE ALSO DISTRIBUTED THOUSANDS OF CONDOMS TO THE COMMUNITY.

1 in 4 people living with HIV is a woman according to the CDC, with African American women disproportionately affected. while providing education about the harm inflicted on women and the community.



### WE'VE EDUCATED 800 COMMUNITY MEMBERS INCLUDING SOCIAL WORKERS, LAW ENFORCEMENT, SERVICE CLUBS, AND COLLEGE STUDENTS.

Importantly, through our long-term partnership with Kaiser Permanente, we have educated 152 women about interpersonal violence, increasing their knowledge and changing attitudes about violence in the home.

This year, we are working in collaboration with Dignity Health to make sure women know how to use health care to create a healthy life for themselves and their children.



Our work is possible because 75 volunteers donated more than 1000 hours to our mission and the women we serve.
