1. High Schooler: Hi, I'm Cecelia. I'm a sophomore at Liberty High School. I hear you're sponsoring a Future Leader Culture badge.

Garrison representative:

That's right. My name is Kathryn Toure, from Garrison Cultural Center – in the Northland, where 30% of metro Kansas Citians reside. Are you interested in the badge?

2. High Schooler: Yeah, but I was wondering what I have to do to earn it.

Garrison representative:

There are <u>five</u> XPs or experiences. <u>For one</u> of them, you <u>visit</u>, <u>hopefully with a team</u>, a <u>site</u> of historical and cultural significance to the <u>people of Clay County</u>.

3. High Schooler: What if I'm interested in African-American culture?

Garrison representative:

Then you could visit <u>Garrison School</u>, for example, near downtown Liberty. It was established in 1877 for black students in the community.

4. High Schooler: Wow, I've been to Liberty's downtown square many times, but I've never seen the school.

Garrison representative:

So this'll be an <u>opportunity</u> for you to <u>learn</u> more about your community. <u>Visit</u> the school with friends or family, send us a <u>photo</u> with a written or audio <u>file</u> about what you learn, and you'll be <u>on your way</u> to earning the **Future Leader Culture badge**.

5. High Schooler: That's all I have to do?

Garrison representative:

You'll also need to <u>visit</u> the Clay County Archives to learn about some Clay County pioneers, and <u>interview</u> someone in the community, about cultural, historical or leadership issues. Then <u>meet</u> with others working on the badge to <u>present</u> and discuss as a team what you learned.

6. High Schooler: Wow, it sounds like this goes beyond what we learn at school. But what opportunities will the badge unlock for me? I want to be a teacher, a politician, or a businesswoman.

Garrison representative:

In all those professions, Cecelia, you need to know and <u>care</u> about community, <u>cooperate and communicate</u> with others, and <u>contribute to change</u>. In our increasingly <u>diverse</u> and <u>multicultural country</u>, you'll need to understand the <u>complexities</u> of society. Plus, you learn and practice skills in <u>interviewing</u>, <u>oral history</u>, <u>archival research</u>, <u>synthesizing</u> new information, and preparing audiovisual presentations.

7. High Schooler: Sounds intimidating.

Garrison representative:

Don't worry. It'll be fun. You can ask questions. You'll receive feedback and support. Most importantly, you'll be proud of your achievements.

8. High Schooler: But what about concrete opportunities and connections, while I'm still in high school?

Garrison representative:

You could <u>meet someone</u> from an organization where you would like to intern or work over the summer. We will be working with many partners, such as:

- the Liberty school district,
- William Jewell College, and
- the Clay County Historical Society.
- **9. High Schooler**: Impressive. I'm almost sold. Any other opportunities?

Garrison representative:

The experience could inform and transform your <u>college application essays</u>. The badge will stimulate your curiosity and <u>put you in contact</u> with new <u>places</u>, <u>people</u>, <u>organizations and ideas</u>. All this will help <u>you</u>, and your <u>community</u>, whether you become an <u>architect</u>, an <u>electrician or a <u>social</u> worker.</u>

10. High Schooler: Or a doctor or an engineer. But can you all really pull this project off?

Garrison representative:

At Garrison Cultural Center, we have a <u>decade of experience</u> and have <u>mentored</u> over 200 high schoolers. We look forward to <u>sharing</u> some of our approaches to <u>leadership building</u> and <u>community and cultural awareness</u> on a digital learning platform, and to <u>serving</u> young people in Liberty and beyond.
