I am so glad to be here in Burlington, Iowa! It is fully grant funded so there is no cost to either congregation for us to participate.

At the SEIA Synod Assembly, I was elected as a voting member to attend Churchwide Assembly in 2025! I am honored to be selected and look forward to learning more about our synod as well as churchwide. This year I am a chaplain at the Youth Gathering. It will be my very first time attending the Youth Gathering as well as being in New Orleans. I'm excited for this opportunity to serve the ELCA in this way as well as represent Messiah and Bethany at the Youth Gathering.

As far as things that I do for fun outside of church life, I love to read! I already have my Burlington Library card and signed up to be part of the Summer Reading Program! It's wonderful that they have activities for adults for summer reading! I also love to dance and be near the water. One of the first


