According to John 15:13, Jesus said to his disciples on the night before he was crucified, "Greater love has no one than this; to lay down your life for your friends." That verse has over and over again been quoted and referred to in connection with many acts of selfsacrifice ever since, and especially those that have been done in the midst of armed combat. Heroism in war has always been a fitting subject for use of that verse, and Lord knows, there's been enough war through the years to have plenty of heroes to honor with it!

A truism about war is that "the longer the casualty lists, the greater the need to justify the slain". Sometimes I think that this is what gave birth to our routinely saying that people killed in battle "gave their lives". Please don't consider me to be disrespectful when I say, "*No, they didn't <u>give their lives.</u>*" None of those people *wanted* to die; their lives were <u>taken</u> from them. To say otherwise is to, in my opinion, give "glamour" to war that it doesn't deserve-read any account of combat given by the people in the thick of it, and you'll readily see what I mean by that.

I've digested literature about war all my life, even from childhood (it really is, as any war correspondent will tell you, "the world's most powerful narcotic"--no matter how horrifying it is, one keeps being drawn back to it). There are war stories about people smothering live hand grenades with their bodies, so as to save other nearby comrades from death or serious injury-*-they* can truthfully be said to have "*given* their lives". And yet, even *they* were involved in something that they'd rather not be doing, in a place where they'd rather not be.

Several years ago I met a very young Marine at a funeral I was doing. He came to the funeral in his dress blues, and as one of the pallbearers, he rode to the cemetery with me and the other pallbearers. At one point in the conversation he said that he really, really wanted to be deployed; I recall responding with something like, "And if and when you are, I hope that it's worthy of your commitment to it." And it struck me that I had just heard an example of why the big majority of fighting men are around the age of 20--in great physical shape, and not yet old enough to see a very big picture of the world around them; in other words, relatively easy to *mold into* fighting men (and these days, fighting *women*).

As we draw closer to another Memorial Day. let's by all means give some love and honor to all those who served our country in our nation's military, who either died in battle or who died a more natural death. And come to think of it, let's give some love and honor to all who in this life served their country in ways *other than* the military.

By definition, "Memorial" Day is about "remembering". As Lutheran Christians, it's a good time to remember that God rules two kingdoms--the everlasting Kingdom of God, and the temporary "kingdom" of earthly governments and institutions. In the Kingdom of God, there's no need for a military or a police force, or for that matter, a government; but in the "Kingdom" of this world, there *is*, and always will be. So, for us who are godly people, there is always good reason to say, not only to veterans, but to all who honorably work for the good of God's world, "*Thank you for your service.*"

Summer-long study of the church throughout the ages:

The world is changing underneath our feet. These changes have had an enormous impact on the church. But how do we know how to respond if we don't know who we are? And how do we know where to go if we don't know what paths are open?

As the church faces changing times, the temptation is to define our path in narrow terms. Usually, these are membership, finances, and cultural influence. But what if these goals are unrealistic? What if they were never all that faithful?

The church does not make itself up as it goes. The church has a history. Many Christians before us have faced devastating challenges. We have a lot to learn from them. And they have inspiration to offer us about how to face an uncertain future with faith and hope, too.

The church also has a theological heritage. And the Lutheran church is no exception. In fact, the Lutheran church may be one of the modern forms of Christianity that is most defined by its theological heritage. The Lutheran confession offers us a way of thinking about the church and the world that is both realistic and doggedly Christian. So, let's spend the summer examining the history of the church!

First, we will survey the history of the church up to the Reformation. After that, we will study the history of Lutheranism in North America. While we study that, we will also read Martin Luther himself! In our reading of Luther, we will examine how our founder navigated tremendous change on the ground. Lastly, we will have presentations focusing on historical moments when the church had to address major issues in real-time. And all the while, we will consider how all this relates to us right now.


Outreach donations for May will be canned fruits and soups! Please, place your items in the cart in the church foyer. Your donations are greatly appreciated and go to help area food pantries.


