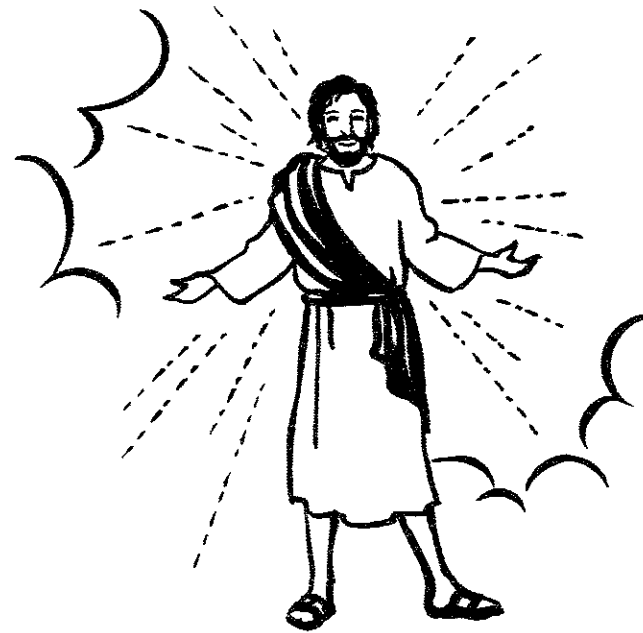
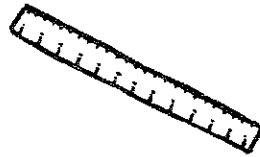
Jesus, our ruler

A. a powerful leader of people

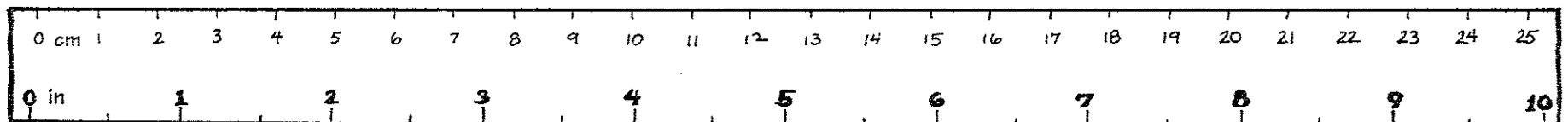
B. a guide to use when measuring things

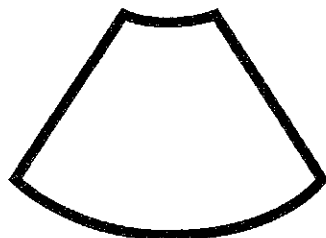
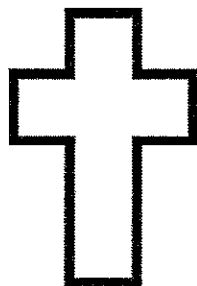
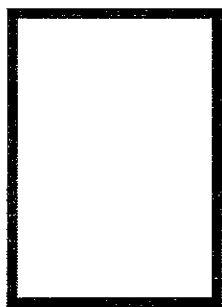

Circle the one that matches your church, or draw your own in the space below.

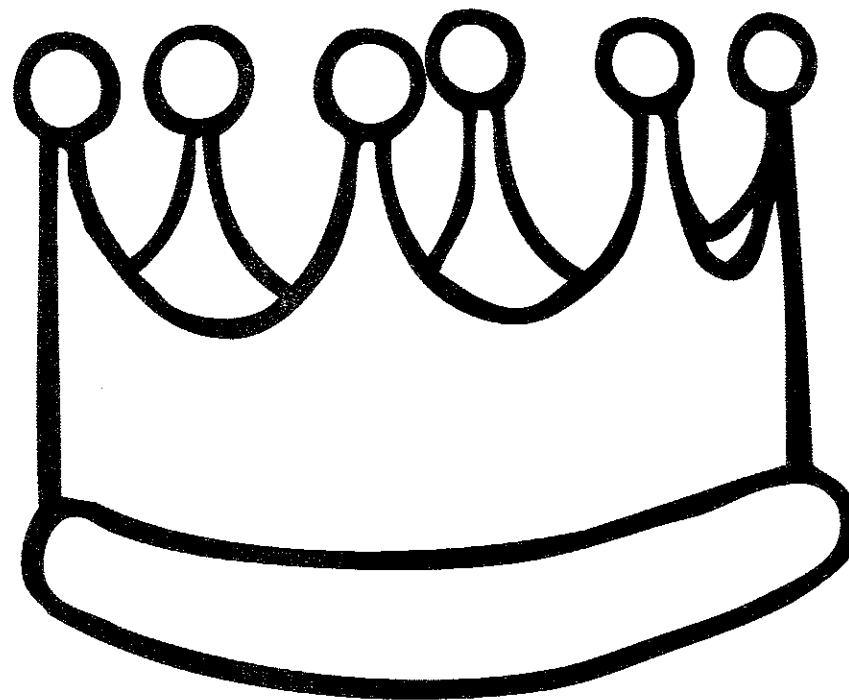

"Are you the king of the Jews?"

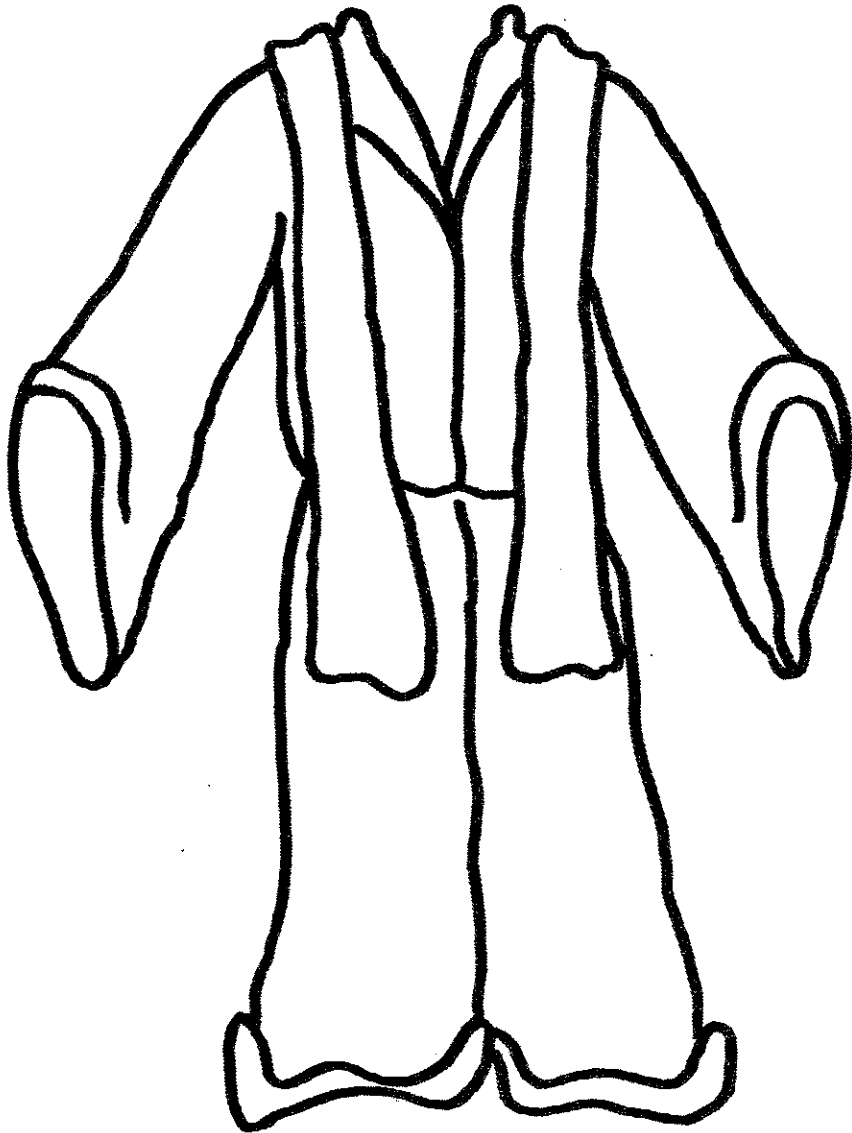
Today's Psalm says that God is "robed in majesty" (Psalms 93:1 a). What could a robe like that look like?

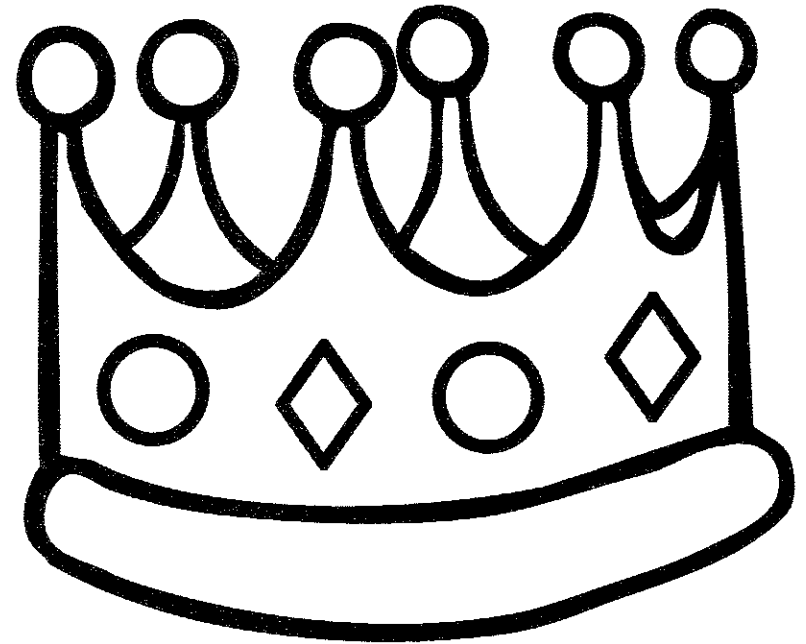

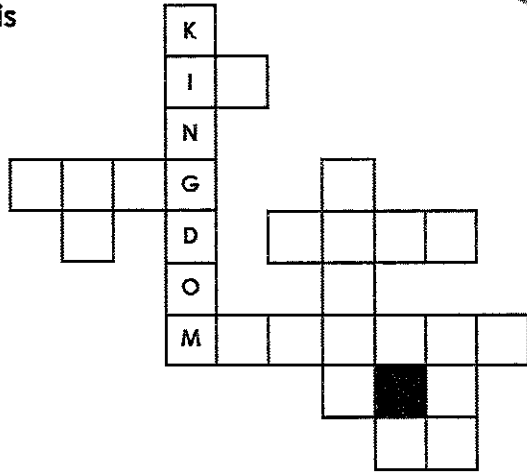

Positions of Power

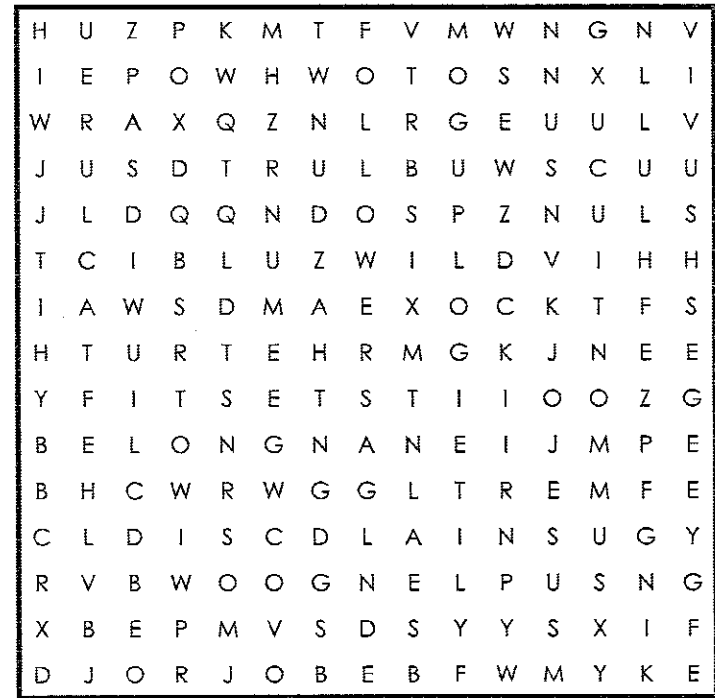
