

Dear Friends in Ministry

How is your Lenten Journey going? Are you choosing God in your wilderness? Do you try to hear what God hears and see what God sees? Have you obeyed what God has whispered in your ears?

I was so grateful last Sunday for completing all 12 sessions of CONFIRMATION CLASS. Our six confirmands have tried hard to fulfill their requirements: Wren Driscoll, Alex Dunn, Jacob Lukacs, Griffin Slay, Dylie Slay, and Logan Wolff. I asked them what they have learned from their Confirmation Journey. They answered: "I learned that Faith Walk is not easy," "Faith journey requires lots of work," "Confirmation journey is a serious one." I am so proud of them. And I'd like to THANK seven teachers who taught classes: Jen & Rick Dunn, Becca Feldermann, Michelle Monsef, Marcie & Julius Lukacs and myself. I also deeply appreciate the hard work of confirmation mentors throughout seven-month journey. They are Jeff Schults, David Funk, John Moore, Dennis Buckley, Jerry Walton and Katie Moore. They have met with their mentees over 10 times. CONFIRMATION SUNDAY will be Sunday May 20<sup>th</sup> which is also Pentecost Sunday. Please pray for their experience at a Bishop's Retreat which will be held twice on March 2nd – 3rd at Monte Toyon and on April 6th – 7th at Camp Lodestar. They will learn there what Confirmation is all about from our very own Bishop *Minerva G. Carcaño*.

Every year during Lent, we experience a very meaningful spiritual journey through the Good Friday Service. Without the walk through the Holy Week, there will be no truly alive joy of Easter! During the Good Friday Service, we will recall the betrayal by Judas, the arrest and torture of Jesus, the desertion of the disciples, and Jesus' crucifixion, death and burial. It is the most somber day of the church year. The service will make use of gradually diminishing light through the extinguishing of candles to symbolize the events of that week from the triumphant Palm Sunday entry through Jesus' burial. We will make dramatic and effective use of simultaneous decreasing of the lights as each candle is extinguished. You are invited to participate in this Good Friday Service at 7 pm Friday on March 30th.

## SUPPORT OUR 2018 MINISTRIES

A big **thank you** goes out to everyone for supporting our ministries here at Brentwood Community United Methodist Church! With your generosity, our church budget for 2018 is \$202,214, which equals **\$16,851** each month.

Did you know that our PG&E bill is forecasted to reach \$7,000 this year? In addition, with garbage, water, and other utilities, will cost \$11,440. Our large facility's maintenance projects will cost \$15,700. The mortgage and multiple insurance costs have been allocated to be \$23,356. The copy machine lease runs \$3,500 yearly, including administrative office expenses, for a total of \$6,325.

Our ministries, which include music, children's education, leadership, outreach, and new ministries, will run approximately \$5,650. The remainder of the budget is for our staff. Our spiritual staff includes Rev. Hyesung Lee, Pastor; Rebecca Feldermann, Youth Director; Alivia Logan, Choir Director; and our Music Accompanists, Greg Pacquer and Lugh Baxter. The remainder of staff includes Debra Urzua, Office Manager; Blanca Malagon, Custodian; and Childcare Providers Ryan Pospisil and Jordan Pospisil.

A concern for the Finance Committee is meeting all financial commitments on a monthly basis. It is very helpful when everyone pays their monthly pledge or even pays their pledge in advance, so that the church can be a good steward and pay its bills on time.






