2019 CHURCH CONFERENCE MINUTES THE BRENTWOOD COMMUNITY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH 809 SECOND STREET, BRENTWOOD, CA 94513 SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 2019 PRESIDING ELDER: Rev. Schuyler Rhodes (Los Rios District Superintendent)

Members of the BCUMC Congregation were invited into the sanctuary at 12:25 P.M. Two handouts were distributed to each attendee. 1) The Agenda and Committee Reports for this Conference meeting and 2) The United Methodist Book of Discipline (pp 95-96) Leadership Covenant.

The meeting began at 12:29 P.M. with a Prayer from Lay Leader Julius Lukcas. Julius asked everyone to read together the Leadership Covenant.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT: Presented by JoAnn Funk.

Total number of members at this time = 150.

Celebration of eight New Members; Loss of four members this year: Three to death and one member unresponsive to several attempts to contact him. Four members have been inactive and the Membership Committee has made attempts to contact them. Rev. Rhodes said a prayer for those members who have passed away this year: Lou Bronzan, Dorothy Pontsler, and Beverly Johnson .

The membership report was approved by a showing of hands. There were no objections or abstentions.

Rev. Rhodes thanked JoAnn for the Membership Report with excellent records being kept. He talked about the early Wesley rules for accountability and how the Membership Records are a valuable pastoral care tool.

ELECTION OF RECORDING SECRETARY: Michael Ann Honea was introduced as the Recording Secretary for this Conference Meeting: Rev. Rhodes asked for a raise of hands for those who voted yes for Michael Ann to record notes of the Conference. All were in favor with no objections or abstentions. Michael Ann will record notes of this entire Church Conference.

PASTOR'S COMPENSATION PACKAGE: At 12:40 P.M. Polly Gallagher, SPRC Chair, presented the information for the Pastor's Compensation Package. The Pastor will receive a cash increase of \$1,411.92 for the year 2020 for a total Cash Compensation of \$52,275.82. The increase to the Pastor is approximately 3% which is slightly above the Conference designated increase of 2.7%. The Package allows payment of Health Insurance premiums of \$9,010 (share by Concord UMC), Pension & Benefit Expense of \$11,535.13, and Accountable Reimbursements for Professional Expenses of \$3,800.00.

The Pastor lives in the Parsonage and utilities are paid up to \$3,800 directly by the Church. The Parsonage cost is shared by her Pastor Husband's church. <u>THE TOTAL OF ALL CLERGY COMPENSATON AMOUNTS, PLUS</u> <u>HEALTH INSURANCE AND EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT COSTS IS</u> \$76,620.95.

<u>Rev. Rhodes asked for a show of hands for those who favored the Pastor's Compensation as presented – all</u> were in favor with no objections or abstentions. The Pastor's Package was approved

Nominations & Lay Development: Pastor Hyesung Lee

Nomination of Trustees:

Rev Rhodes stated that the State of California requires a Board of Trustees for the Church. This is a legal entity and the Board of Trustees receive and manage the Trust. Up to nine members can be on the Board of Trustees and up to one-third do not need to be members of the UMC.

Two people have been nominated to serve on the Board of Trustees Committee: Larry Schaffer and Jeff Schults. Pastor Lee stated: "I move that the Secretary cast a ballot favoring the nominee for the Board of Trustees and the Secretary note in the minutes that the nominees were elected by ballot" <u>There was a secret ballot vote</u>: All of the voting attendees were asked to write the names of Larry Schaffer and Jeff Schults on the back of the "Leadership Covenant" handout IF they chose to vote for these two men as new members of the Board of Trustees. The ballots were collected and counted. <u>Thirty ballots were collected – all voting for Larry Schaffer and Jeff Schults</u>. <u>Larry Schaffer and Jeff Schults were for the Board of Trustees as of January 1, 2020</u>. The Board of Trustees will elect the chairman at the first meeting.

Pastor Lee gave an explanation of the BCUMC 2020 MINISTRY TEAMS AND STRUCTURE indicating: * = new members, ______ = need a member, (name in parenthesis) = pending final confirmation.

Julius Lukcas has been the Lay Leader for ten years. He has four boys and his time as Lay Leader has diminished. Beginning in 2020 Dave Funk will work with Julius as another Lay Leader and will share responsibilities with committee work and serving the Pastor.

The Pastor reviewed the three parts of the Ministry Team Structure:

1. <u>Connecting Ministry: Connecting Ministry – connecting with God through the Word and Worship:</u> Music Committee, Worship Stewards (Ushers, Greeters, Acolyte/Crucifer Coordinators, Altar Guild, Social Hour and Flower Coordinator, Video/Audio. Creative Worship Team.

2. <u>Growing Ministry: Connecting with God through Teaching and Nurturing</u>: Young Christians Ministry, Bible/Book study group, Voyagers (60+), Midtown Faith (20-59), Creative Intentional Spiritual Formation

3. <u>Serving Ministry; Connecting with God through Healing and Supporting:</u> Administrative Council, Board of Trustees, Staff-Parish Relations, Finance-Stewardship, Nominations & Lay Development, Membership Committee, Congregational Care network, HOPE House committee, United Methodist Women, United Methodist men, Endowment & Memorials, Reconciling ministry Committee/Safe Space Committee.

<u>Rev. Rhodes asked for a show of hands for those who favored the Nomination Report as presented.</u> <u>all were in favor with no objections or abstentions. The Nominations Report was approved.</u> The Official part of this meeting was over at 12:50 P.M. Respectfully submitted,

Díd You Know There Are Angels in The Church?

The Board of Trustees works really hard to make sure the church buildings and grounds are kept in good repair. Trustees are also responsible for the furniture and interior of our buildings. Trustees have a budget from the Finance Committee to pay for repairs and replacement of things around the church.



I have a story to tell about what has happened this year.

Earlier this year, Trustees decided that replacing the old red folding chairs in the Fellowship Hall was a priority item that we could afford. Research was done, samples were ordered, polls were taken, a style was chosen, and the chairs were ordered. When the bill arrived, an angel came forward and offered to pay for the new chairs.

A volunteer (not a church member) at H.O.P.E. House was concerned about the condition of the old carpet and vinyl flooring. The floors were very hard to keep clean. This angel donated funds to replace the floors at H.O.P.E. House with new, easy to clean, wood flooring. At the same time, other angels provided time and materials for the H.O.P.E. House check-in desk and shelving improvements.

Trustees then turned their attention to the venetian blinds in the Sunday School rooms. Many of the slats were bent or broken. One set of slats in the nursery had tooth marks on them! Trustees decided that replacing the blinds would be the next priority item to address. We could afford the purchase because we did not have to spend money for chairs or floors. Research was done, a style was selected, and the blinds were ordered and installed. When the bill arrived, another angel came forward and offered to pay for the new blinds.

After getting new chairs and new blinds, Trustees turned their attention to replacing two windows in the Pastor's office and one in the Sunday School as the next priority item that needed to be addressed. We certainly could afford the project because we didn't pay for chairs, floors or blinds. Again, research was done and contractors were invited to quote the work. One of the contractors, who attends a church in Dublin, was impressed by what we are doing here. After he gave us a quote for the work and left, the contractor called back and said he was moved to donate the materials and labor for the project. Another angel (who doesn't even live here)!!

THESE ANGELS CONTRIBUTED GOODS AND SERVICES THAT TOTALED ALMOST \$13,000!

There are many angels associated with our church. Angels support the church with their regular pledges and offerings. Angels support the church in response to special pleas and fundraisers. Angels appear unbidden and pay for chairs, floors, blinds and windows.

While I have focused on "Angel Giving" that happened this year, I need to say that this is not something new. In prior years, angels have provided double paned insulated windows for the Sunday School and video projectors and screens for the Youth Room, Sunday School, Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall, paper towels, cleaning and kitchen supplies.

It is my prayer that other angels will appear as Trustees embark on projects in 2020.
