

BCUMC Ad Council created a BCUMC RE-OPENING TASK FORCE on June 24, 2020 with the following members as California-Nevada Conference of UMC recommended:

<u>Members</u>: Hyesung Lee (Pastor); Julius Lukacs (Lay leaders), David Funk (Lay leaders); Kevin Gray (Co-Chair of Trustees), Jeff Schults (Co-Chair of Trustees); Polly Gallagher (Chair of SPRC); Michelle Carrillo (Office Administrator); Becca Feldermann (Youth Director); Alivia Logan (Choir Director); Dennis Buckley (Video/Audio); Jerry Walton (HOPE HOUSE); Michael Ann Honea (CCN, Task Force Recording Secretary)

First Meeting (6:30 pm July 7):

- Task Force mission is (1) to develop BCUMC Relaunch Plan; (2) to communicate the Plan with the congregation; (3) to train Staff and Volunteers to be trained safe-guards according to the Plan; (4) to implement the Plan in actual worship and ministry activities; (5) to review and adjust the Plan according to changing situations and guidelines.
- Online Live Worship Service will continue no matter when In-Person is fully allowed
- Under 6 feet social distancing guideline, maximum capacity has been measured by Dennis and David
- Much discussion was made regarding limiting the attendance, the roles of ushers/greeters, possibility of outdoor service.

Second Meeting (7 pm July 21):

- LOVE4LEARNING (Preschool on BCUMC property) has been approved for its opening by Los Rios District Superintendent Rev. Goto
- Wedding of Alivia Logan and Jeff Kumagai has been approved by DS Rev. Goto but only for Outdoor to be held on July 25th
- Indoor Worship Service is not allowed until further notice by Conference and County
- Task Force decided to work on developing BCUMC Relaunch Plan while waiting for our In-Person Worship Opening Day.
- Task Force has discussed our visions and values that will guide our congregation through transition due to COVID-19 Pandemic:
 - **Vision Statement:** (Our ultimate goals for Relaunching Plan)
 - To stay together in love and support one another
 - To offer all possible connectivity to the congregation during the Pandemic

 - To show the world the true characters of Christ as His visible Body

 - Affirming everyone's choice (to come or not to come): not judgmental toward others' choice; there is neither brave/coward nor spiritual/less-spiritual choice but only necessary/safe/faithful choice
 - Gentle to People, Hard to Principles (We may be a bad cop in action but a loving safeguard in our intention toward those who do not follow guidelines during gatherings)
 - Teamwork Makes Us Stronger (consistent and thorough practices will make us strong and safe)
 - Staying together safely is better than going faster (no need to rush)
