† Pastor's Letter †

Dear Siblings in Christ Jesus

We are thrilled to celebrate the 9th Anniversary of our congregation becoming Reconciling on Sunday, August 25th. This momentous decision, made in 2015, solidified our commitment to being a fully inclusive Christian community. I encourage you to read Heidi Stark's insightful article in this month's D's and O's, which delves into the history and significance of this important step.

As we commemorate this milestone, I want to share my daughter June's journey as a transgender woman. My hope is to offer support and encouragement to other parents and families navigating similar challenges. June thrives in the welcoming environments of both Central UMC in Stockton (where my husband serves) and Brentwood Community UMC. Her experiences highlight the importance of LGBTQIA+ visibility within our church and inspire others to join our community.

While I briefly shared June's story on June 2nd, I believe it's essential to provide more context. June, born male, has always exhibited feminine traits. However, it wasn't until April of this year that she openly expressed her transgender identity. As parents, we often feel we've done everything possible, but for some, finding the courage to transition takes time. During this challenging period, June endured severe depression and anxiety.

A turning point came during her visit to Korea in September 2023. My mother's unconditional love and support were instrumental in boosting June's confidence. Surrounded by the love of her family, she began to open up.

June found solace in our shared daily devotionals and reengaged in family activities like our daily walks. She took steps towards independence by cleaning the house, handling chores, and pursuing higher education. Acceptance into the University of Pacific marked a significant milestone.

A meeting with Rev. Alyss Swanson, the first transgender female ordained deacon pastor, during the Annual Conference provided invaluable support and guidance. June felt a renewed sense of hope and purpose. Her first Sunday worship service at BCUMC as a woman was a joyful experience filled with acceptance.

The journey of a transgender individual is undoubtedly challenging, but it's heartening to witness the progress made. With supportive communities and the unwavering love of God, individuals can find strength and hope. Let us continue to create a welcoming and inclusive space for all. Thank you for your love and support. Amen.



Lay Leader News By Heidi Stark

When Dave Funk, Pastor, and I met in July, one of the topics we discussed was being a reconciling congregation. What does that mean? In August we will celebrate nine years as a Reconciling Church. Back in 2015 (this was before I became a member), BCUMC went through a process of study and discernment regarding becoming a Reconciling Church and was required to affirm the foundational statement of Reconciling Ministries (rmnetwork.org) by a vote of at least 75%. Below is the foundational statement of Reconciling Ministries:

"We celebrate God's gift of diversity and value the wholeness made possible in community equally shared and shepherded by all. We welcome and affirm people of every gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation, who are also of every age, race, ethnicity, physical and mental ability, level of education, and family structure, and of every economic, immigration, marital, and social status, and so much more. We acknowledge that we live in a world of profound social, economic, and political inequities. As followers of Jesus, we commit ourselves to the pursuit of justice and pledge to stand in solidarity with all who are marginalized and oppressed." In 2015, BCUMC affirmed this statement by a vote of 96%! If I had been a member at that time, I too would have voted in the affirmative. Like most churches our mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We specifically state that:

"Brentwood Community United Methodist Church is a welcoming and reconciling congregation, affirming its ministry with the whole family of God regardless of age, race, ethnic origin, economic situation, gender identity, sexual orientation, or marital status."

What's next after becoming a Reconciling Church? How do we put our words into action? How do we walk the talk? I think we are a friendly and welcoming group of people, but how do we need to grow in our understanding of how we can pursue justice for all. We have a Reconciling Committee that is doing an excellent job of making us more aware of ways to affirm and support all people. It's also important to realize and recognize that not everyone is "onboard". Maybe you have questions or feel confused. It can be a lot to wrap your head around. I try to be open and nonjudgemental, but I don't have a perfect understanding of the best ways to affirm and support all people. I know that I don't always use language that would be considered inclusive, and I don't always know how to do that, but I'm certainly willing to learn and grow. I hope that we will all be open to new ideas and ways to think that embrace Jesus' loving examples and show our commitment to discipleship and transformation of the world.

When I'm asked about my church, I share that I am proud to be a member of BCUMC, and that as a member I except Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior. That at BCUMC we believe that ALL are welcome, and we strive to be open and understanding. Come, learn, and grow.

Dr. Haley Feuerbacher is the Executive Director of The Center for Courageous Compassion. She is a storyteller, creator, adventurer, spiritual activist, and theologian. She completed her Ph.D. at Southern Methodist University in Religion and Culture and Women's and Gender Studies, where she served on faculty. She has also taught at The Seattle School for Theology & Psychology and served for several years as a youth minister and then as campus minister for a United Methodist Reconciling college ministry. Passionate about the power of joy and compassion for personal and systemic transformation, Haley

is currently the founder and executive director of the Center for Courageous Compassion. The Center for Courageous Compassion is a nonprofit organization that is fighting compassion fatigue and burnout by creating sustainability in our activism and ministry with survivors of abuse and trauma through liberating our compassion and courage from exhaustion and exploitation, re-wilding our joy, and transforming trauma in ourselves and our systems. In addition to this life-giving mission, Haley is also a running coach at Fleet Feet Monterey, a yoga facilitator at M8 Wellness, a surfing and outdoor enthusiast, and an author, with her first book, "Single (M)Other", available later this year through Wipf & Stock.


