

✝ Pastor's Letter ✝

Dear My Family of God

Grace and peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ.

As we approach the season of Lent, I have been reflecting on the theme of our upcoming Sunday Lenten Study: "**An Unlikely Lent: Extraordinary People of the Easter Story**". While we will be gathering for six weeks starting February 22 to look at the "unlikely" figures who surrounded Jesus, I want to challenge us to live out our own "unlikely" journey this year.

Our Savior, Jesus, was the master of the unlikely. As a Jewish Rabbi, he did the unexpected: he ate with outcasts, touched the "untouchable," and responded to violence with a transformative, self-giving love. If we are to follow him, perhaps our Lenten discipline for 2026 shouldn't just be about "giving something up," but about doing something truly **unlikely**.

What would it look like for you to embrace the unlikely during these forty days? Here are a few suggestions for things you might choose to do—or unlikely things you might choose *not* to do:

Unlikely Things to Do

- **The Unlikely Bridge:** Reach out to someone in your life or community with whom you have a deep disagreement. Instead of arguing, invite them for a cup of coffee just to listen to their story.
- **The Unlikely Sabbath:** In our hyper-productive world, dedicate one hour a week to doing absolutely nothing "productive"—no phone, no chores—simply resting in the presence of God's light.
- **The Unlikely Gift:** Give a "sacrificial" gift of time or resources to a cause that serves those at the margins, especially those facing the anxieties of our current national climate.

Unlikely Things *Not* to Do

- **The Unlikely Silence:** Practice "not-venting." When you feel the urge to complain or share a piece of gossip, choose an unlikely silence and offer a silent prayer for the person or situation instead.
- **The Unlikely Fast:** Fast from the "scroll." Choose not to check news or social media for the first hour of your day, replacing that anxiety with a moment of scripture or reflection.
- **The Unlikely "No":** If you are someone who constantly says "yes" to the point of burnout, practice the unlikely "no." Say no to a busy task so you can say "yes" to your spiritual health and your family.

I extend to you a very unlikely invitation to TWO Lenten Bible Study Groups (see more information about these two in this Newsletter). You can choose one or both to attend:

- **Byron UMC** Wednesday Group with Rev. Sungho Lee
- **Brentwood Community UMC** Sunday Group with Rev. Hyesung Lee

Everyone is invited to this journey as we seek the ever-present love and light of God in our shadowed world. Let us walk this unlikely path together, trusting that the Holy Spirit will bring comfort and healing to us all.

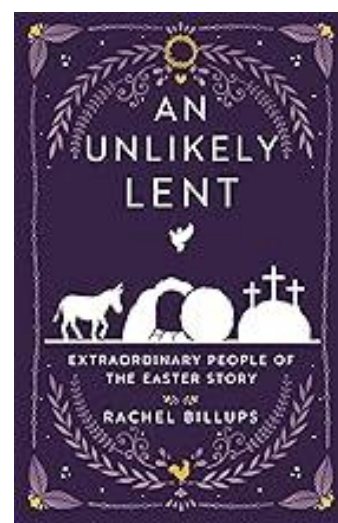

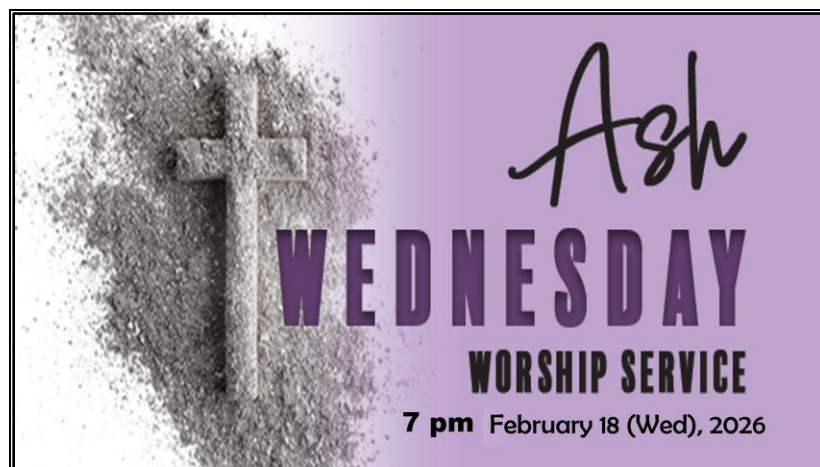

Lay Leader News By Heidi Stark

I loved Pastor's Friday email from January 23rd. She mentioned that many of our members and friends have been dealing with illnesses and grief and then we look beyond our personal experiences and see our country and our world dealing with great evil and suffering. We want healing – we want peace. Pastor went on to explain the difference between physical cure and spiritual healing. Healing is the restoration of the whole being to God. A cure is a function of the body; healing is a function of the soul. As I have walked my cancer journey, I have asked God to cure me physically and to heal me mentally, emotionally, and spiritually. Today (January 30th), is the first of my 15 radiation treatments which will be completed on February 20th. Am I anxious? Yup! I'm anxious because this is a new experience for me, and I have no idea how my body will respond – scary stuff. This morning, as I read The Upper Room devotional the Bible verse was from 1 Peter. **Cast all your anxiety on him, because he cares for you. – 1 Peter 5:7.** I trust that God is with me today as I go into radiation and every day. My greatest desire is to go where He leads me and do His will.

As we enter February, a month associated with *LOVE*, we may feel skeptical as many of us have experienced how human love can waver and change over time. You may have experienced disappointment and feel unable to trust or unworthy of love. Please remember that **you are loved** – God loves you no matter what! I'm reading a delightful book, *The Borrowed Life of Frederick Fife*. There is a line in the book that reads, "Love is...about picking someone up and never, ever putting them down again, no matter how heavy things become." God's love is consistent, inclusive, and unchanging. He loved us so much that He sent His son, Jesus to save us and make us whole. Wednesday, February 18th is Ash Wednesday, the start of Lent. Lent is an opportunity to make a change. Lent is the 40 days (excluding Sundays) leading up to Easter on April 5th. Lent is about change – change of heart – change of attitude. We are called to open ourselves to God during Lent to examine our relationship with Him. We are asked to repent and turn to God. Lent is a good time to reflect on the values and priorities in our lives. Many people give something up – make a sacrifice during the 40 days of Lent; another option is to take on a spiritual discipline to draw nearer to God. Those 40 days of Lent are an opportunity to change and build your relationship with God.

This year, I am hoping that during Lent I will feel physically healthier and stronger. I want to embrace a new chapter in my life. I want to go where God takes me; I want healing for my soul. I hope you'll join me on this Lenten journey and see how God restores you. Let's all draw close to God and God's love for all.

Heavenly Father, help us to prioritize You above all else in our lives. We surrender our worries and desires to You, allowing Your divine wisdom to guide our choices. May we align our hearts with Your purposes, fostering peace and clarity in our daily actions. Amen

Stewardship 2026

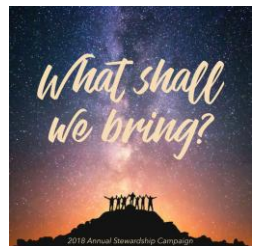
