

Dear Friends in Ministry


I hope you all had a Happy Thanksgiving. And I pray for your Blessed December as we are approaching to the end of this year. For this month's pastor's letter, I would like to share my report to Ad Council on November 8th as I summarized my ministry of this year. I appreciate your faithful ministry for this year and am looking forward taking a new journey in 2018. Here is my report:

Our mission is to *make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world*. And my primary task as pastor is to make sure our congregation (1) to know the mission, (2) to participate in Disciple-making Process (Connect-Grow-Serve) and (3) to do make disciple-making-disciples.

The most rewarding part of 2017 ministry was to see so many people having stepped up either in their leadership role or participation. Because of that, existing ministries have been strengthened. For our big 150th Anniversary celebration, everyone stepped up in their participation and contribution. I am hugely grateful for this shining moment of BCUMC.

The second rewarding part was to see several new additions made as Disciple-Making Process. The followings are new additions to our church ministry in 2017:

- (1) Wednesday Prayer (since March 1st 2017) Every Wednesday 6pm 7 pm we have had a quiet prayer time. Two people have attended it for 6 months. After 6 months, number of participants increased 100 % from 2 to 4. This prayer time has been one of the most critical but missing components of discipleship journey in our church.
- (2) Strengthening Friends in Faith Ministry (since August 2017) <Friends in Faith> is a ministry that helps new comers settling down with friendly guides and emotional care. Its Leadership Team has been strengthened. One member volunteered to record worship attendance each Sunday on excel document in order to take better care of visitors and new comers. <Friends in Faith> will work closely with Membership Secretary.
- (3) Covenant Group by using General Rule of Discipleship (since September 2017) The main purpose of Covenant Group is to be accountable to the spiritual growth and the authentic discipleship by following the General Rule of Discipleship as shown below:



Since September, a staff Covenant Group between me and the youth director has begun. My future plan is to encourage Bible Reading Group (and other groups) to be a Covenant Group.

- (4) PPT (Power Point Presentation) for Sunday Worship Service (since Sep 10, 2017) I have received many positive feedbacks so far about the use of Power Point Presentations. Jamie Feldermann & Bob Clarke will join the pastor in creating PPT for Sunday Worship. Paul Slay & David Funk volunteered to be PPT clickers. My hope is to find more effective ways to make our Worship Service communicating God's love with more people.
- (5) Yearly Reflection on Your Lay Ministry (Sept 2017) This year I collected reflective feedbacks from church officers about their fulfillment in their ministries this year. I received 22 responses out of 40 surveys sent out. Most people showed high fulfillment. Many people communicated with me what they need and want for the effective service for the coming year ... very helpful for the work of Nomination Committee.
- (6) CHURCH LEADER TRAINING DAY (Dec 10, 2017) This is a new thing for our church. Rev. Schuyler Rhoads, District Superintendent will preach to us during our morning Worship Service and lead Training Hour at 1 pm.

Pastor's Dream for 2018




