


Wednesdays During Advent

We pray with compassion, without taking sides or pointing fingers. Christ gave us the gift of peace, but it is our responsibility to accept it and use it.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES REPORT ON CURRENT PROJECTS

The Board of Trustees has been busy for the past few months. Some large projects have been completed and we are waiting for quotes for some other projects.



The old galvanized water pipes that ran under the church to the kitchen and the three restrooms nearest the Social Hall have been replaced with new copper water pipes. This has increased the water pressure somewhat, but – more importantly – we are no longer getting rusty water when faucets are first turned on. In addition, the drinking fountain in the Sunday School Hallway has been repaired.

We hired an exterminator to work on the gopher problem we have had in the church and preschool lawns. The gentleman has worked many hours trying to rid us of the critters. We have not seen as many gopher mounds in the lawns as in the past, but there may still be one gopher left. The traps look like round tubes sticking out of the ground. If you see one, please do not tamper with it.

We had to have the locks changed on the church and H.O.P.E. House doors because a master key was lost. Church officers who need a replacement key should contact Dennis Buckley. Everyone who has a key should be very careful with it. The cost to re-key the church exceeded \$1,100.

The Trustees and the Staff-Parish Relations Committee are looking into options for custodial services for the church and Sunday School. So far, we have discussed four options: hiring a licensed and bonded building maintenance company (expensive!), hiring a house cleaner (if you know of a good, reliable house cleaner please let us know), hiring a new employee or continue to rely on volunteers from our own congregation. (Thanks go out to Alivia and Adella Logan for deep cleaning the Sanctuary.)

We have spent nearly \$9,500 on major projects this year. We have been able to do this without appealing to the congregation for money because a sizeable bequest was given to the church that was designated for "Necessary Improvements".

Projects the Trustees are currently getting quotes for include:

- 1) replacing the concrete walkway that leads to the front steps of the church
- 2) replacing one of the accordion doors in the Sunday School
- 3) replacing some window blinds in the Sunday School
- 4) replacing some of the folding chairs in the Social Hall.

Once the numbers are in, the Trustees will decide which projects will be done.

Now that the rainy season is upon us, we are getting concerned about roofs. The Parsonage roof is 23 years old and the church roof may be as old as 40 years. Does anyone remember a roofing project on the church more recent than the 1970s?

If you see something around the church that needs attention, be sure to let one of the Trustees know.

We are still short of pledges to support our ministry, but we continue to have faith that more will be forthcoming. Thank you to all for your continued, loving support of our mission to fulfill God's work in our community and beyond.


