



## A HAPPY FEELING

When I was a child I vividly remember this time of year, it was when we received our tithing envelopes. I was taught by my mother that we should give a small portion of the money we had during the offering. This was money that God needed to keep everything happy and beautiful and to help watch over us in our time of need. I happily gave my “two cents” knowing that it was money well spent. I actually looked forward to it.

We can look at tithing like the support of a beautiful tree. The tree requires water and sunlight to thrive. Our tithe is like the water and sunlight that support our church. Just like the tree, our church community has many processes going on, that support so many realms, in so many people’s lives. Each person is like a leaf absorbing the sunshine and water and supporting the tree as a whole.

Going back to my childhood, at the time I didn’t know about the disciple who gave one out of every ten head to the church. I was always reminded to give what I could, to give what made me happy. Now I look at this and think about the current times and try to compare the value of one out of ten head, ten percent, to something in this day and age that meets this God given requirement. What if the disciple had less than ten head, let’s say he had five head, his tithe would be half a head. Today, what is comparable to heads of livestock; it’s a very complicated thought process and a personal one. I must add, that based on money alone ten percent for someone with a small income really adds up.

However, a tithe includes more than just money; it includes action, being involved. My point is that what you contribute is relative to your current situation and in the end what is really important is that it makes you happy to know that you are supporting the tree.

## 9AM BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP




The 9am book discussion group will be starting on a new book Sunday, November 1st. The book we will be discussing is the New Testament with the books in the order in which they were written. Marcus Borg's book "Evolution of the Word" does this. It is a fabulous book. The first three chapters are worth the price of the book. The first chapter, "A Chronological New Testament" explains why it is important to have a New Testament with the books in the order in which they were written so you can see the Evolution of the Word.

The second chapter is "Before anything was written". Jesus was crucified around 30ad and the first writings of the New Testament were Paul's letters written in the early 50's ad. This chapter deals with the 20 years between Jesus' death and Paul's first letters. He goes into what life was like in the Holy Land in Jesus time and how oral tradition kept the stories of Jesus alive during that period.

The third chapter is "Paul and his Letters". Of the 27 documents of the New Testament, 13 are attributed to Paul. Scholars believe seven are authentic letters of Paul. The other six were written by someone else who attached Paul's name so the letters would be read. Marcus writes commentaries on all 27 books of the New Testament that begins with 1st Thessalonians and ends with 2nd Peter. The 1st Gospel was written around the year 70 and the book of Revelation in the early 90's. The entire New Testament was written between 50ad and around the year 120ad.

I hope you will be joining us on our journey through the New Testament. We meet in the youth room at 9am on Sundays. You don't need a book to start. I have a couple of copies and you can get one used on Amazon for around \$10 including shipping. The couple I bought there were just like new.


As a child, my favorite book was THE LITTLE ENGINE THAT COULD.
