Dear Friends in Ministry

In August 2015, we became a Reconciling Congregation, a member of *Reconciling Ministry Network* which is committed to the full inclusion of Lay Gay Bi-sexual Transgender Queer plus people within The United Methodist Church (see their website https://rmnetwork.org/). Since that moment, we have had visitors from LGBTQ community from time to time. But not even once they joined us as a member. They rather stayed only a few weeks and then left. Their presence in our church has not grown at all. Some people asked me why they would not stay with us. I have wondered that too. Then the change has finally come. After we hung a rainbow flag outside the church building in the beginning of August, a new wave of LGBTQ people has visited and come back Sunday after Sunday to worship with us. And on September 23, one of them finally joined us as a member of our church. Her wife was there with their twin daughters. She clearly had trust and confidence in our commitment to who we say we are. I didn't know that much difference the rainbow flag would make for such a short period of time.

On the other hand, some people (not-related to our church) have questioned us with distress about why we fly it on the outside of a church building. Some of them asked us to take it down because it offends other Christians in the town. It happened only twice so far. Now some of our church members have asked me to help them to be better prepared for such a conversation. So, I prepared the following statement and discussed it with the Reconciling Ministry Committee. The purpose of this statement is to help our church members and friends to use in their conversation with others who are interested in learning more about who we are as a Reconciling Congregation. This can be also used for your conversation with those who question us why we fly the rainbow flag outside.

Ad Council (September 19) asked the Reconciling Ministry Committee to come up with an alternative sign to put on outside the church permanently that would show more faith-related sign/message regarding our belief to welcome All God's Children regardless of any difference including sexual orientation and gender identity. And Ad Council voted to continue to fly the current rainbow flag until the alternate sign is implemented.

Please come to me if you have any concern/worry regarding this matter! You can send me an email or come to me for a conversation with me. It is very very important for us to understand one another in such a time like this and be united. With Ad Council, I will try my best to find the common ground where we all may respectfully support one another.

Why Do We Fly a Rainbow Flag on Our Church Building?

Because we want people to know that we welcome all God's children including Lesbian, Gay, Bi-sexual, Transgender and Queers. God has loved us unconditionally. So we want to do the same to all our neighbors regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity.

Because we are "Reconciling Congregation" a member of *Reconciling Ministry Network* which is committed to the full inclusion of LGBTQplus people within The United Methodist Church. This is who we are. And we want to let others know about us by flying a rainbow flag outside our church building.

Because we believe that a rainbow flag has been the sign for inclusion, acceptance, peace and justice throughout centuries, used by a variety of groups, including LGBTQplus community recently. In the Bible God used the rainbow as the sign for God's covenant for all living things and all creation. We are hoping that LGBTQplus people may recognize the sign and feel safe to enter into our sanctuary.

Because we believe that "human sexuality is a good gift from God," we are "committed to supporting the integration of healthy, loving expressions of sexuality and spirituality for everyone. We celebrate the sexuality and spirituality of same and opposite gender loving persons and pledge to provide resources that lead to a deeper understanding of God's precious gift." (From Reconciling Ministries Network website https://rmnetwork.org/who-we-are/mission/)

Because we "aspire to fulfill our baptismal covenant to recognize and utilize our privileges to resist oppression in whatever form it presents itself in the world." (From RMN website) We are hoping and working as best as we can to build up God's beloved community in our church and beyond where everyone is free to be who they are as they serve God and neighbors with God-given gifts and talents.

Because we would like to invite anyone in the community who wish to have an honest and authentic conversation with us regarding how to build this loving community where we may all grow together as we speak our hearts and dreams in love for all God's children.



Bio of Pastor Quentisha Davis Wiles

Pastor Quentisha was born in 1977 in a Christian family. She had a very ecumenical experience throughout her life attending churches different denominations. She graduated from San Francisco State University (SFSU) with Master Degree in Social Work. In the mid 1990's she worked at A Safe Place Battered Women's Shelter where she co-developed the first Bay Area teen domestic violence program. In 1996, She worked with Parental Stress Services in Alameda County. Pastor Quentisha spent over 18 years working with families in the foster care system in Northern California. She spent an additional five years consulting with parents, organizations, and public institutions promoting family and service provider integration. In the mid 2000's Pastor Quentisha spent four years working with the violence prevention collaborative as a crisis response clinician in the city of Oakland. Pastor Quentisha attended Pacific School of Religion where she obtained her Master of Divinity degree (2016).

Pastor Quentisha served three churches in the California-Nevada conference: Youth Director at Concord UMC, Congregational Care Minister at Jones UMC and is currently serving Pittsburg UMC as Sr. Pastor.


