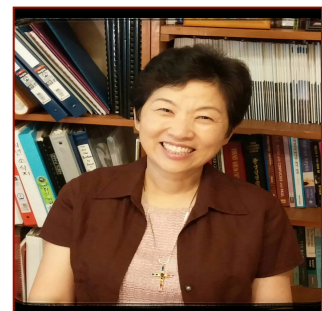
Barbara was healthy physically but did not remember me. Her memory loss was in a severe state from Alzheimer. But her face was filled with smiles. She always had a lot of stories to share with me. We sat down together in a comfy sofa. She kept asking questions about me. I showed her my business card. She found it interesting. And I gave her cookies that Dolores had baked. She was so happy to receive such gift. And she started talking about her dad, a life-time farmer and about her siblings. She said she was a school nurse in Brentwood school district. And she helped out church ladies with various things. And we said the Lord's Prayer out-loud together. She remembered it all. And we sang "Amazing Grace" together. When I pray for her, we hold hands together. She looked really peaceful. I felt the same peace too. I thought to myself that in Heaven I would be with countless brothers and sisters whom I had never known but felt no distance from. It would surely take eternity to get to meet all of them but will enjoy it very much.

And I met *Tim Iddings* on Friday, who used to be our member for a long time. He visited me because his mother, *Louise Iddings*, had passed away and he wanted to have a memorial service for her here at our church. It was our first meeting but Tim was so friendly and shared with me his dear memories of BCUMC. He was raised in our church and had a long loving relationship with our church members. He shared how great the youth ministry was when he was a youth. The pastor at the time had 7 kids himself. He also shared stories of challenging times especially when he was the chair of the trustees. The whole time, he felt so BEING HOME again. He kept saying that "This church was my home!" His eyes looked like seeing all those years with beautiful memories here at BCUMC. I realized that TIME has many dimensions and does not just move from the past to the future but also the other way around. If we wish and allow, TIME also may be circling around at one point at certain space. Tim seemed to find a way home at BCUMC by circling around the time train. And I knew that we all will be arriving at HOME in God just like that someday. And we will meet again all together!

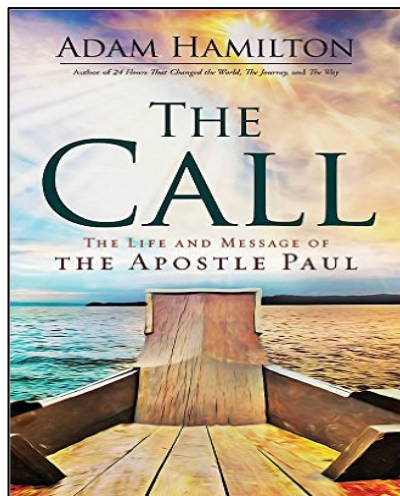
May God bless our journey together wherever we are!

MERRY METHODIST Progressive Dinner



People have been asking about doing another progressive dinner. The two we had were a lot of fun. This is an activity more appropriate for adults. Martin Tucker is willing to plan another dinner but making it happen requires a lot of advanced planning and commitment from people. Here is what is needed:

1) Two homes willing to host the appetizer course. The hosts may provide as much as they are comfortable to do and some of the guests can also provide finger food or some liquid refreshments. About one hour of hosting. Allow 1/2 hour for travel to the next spot.

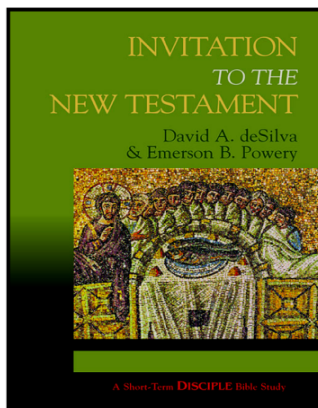
2) Two--possibly three--homes willing to host the main course. Again, some of the guests may be willing to bring some part of the dinner. Merry Methodists also have a small amount of banked money that could help cover costs for dinner hosts. In the past each host home needed to accommodate about 10 people. This meal is not a competition!! It should be relatively simple so people can enjoy mixing and be done in time to move on. About one hour of hosting. Allow 1/2 hour for travel to the church.

3) Two or three hosts for the dessert course which will involve everyone back at the church. They need to provide and serve some desserts.

4) A sign-up of people who will commit in advance to attending since the list must be arranged for people who attend the first course at one place to be mixed with others at the second place. Assigning people to the homes is necessary and must be worked out in advance so everyone knows where they are to go.

If you are willing to participate in hosting please let Martin know so he can begin to put together the whole dinner plan. We are looking at a date maybe in mid-October but it can be done at any time enough people are available.

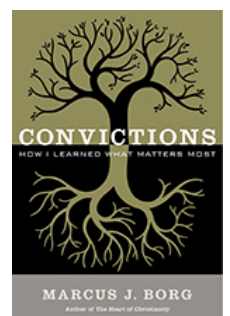

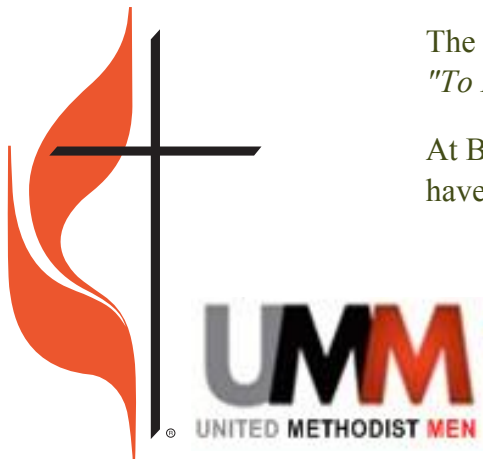
