A Pastor's Prescription for What Ails You

This could be the start of something big.

There are no major spiritual days in June biblically. And rarely do humans come up with something worthy of saying Amen to. But then sometimes we do get it right.

Father's Day

Father's Day was inaugurated in the United States in the early 20th century to compliment Mother's Day in celebrating fathers, fathering, and fatherhood. Father's Day was founded in Spokane, Washington at the YMCA in 1910 by Sonora Smart Dodd, who was born in Arkansas. Its first celebration was in the Spokane YMCA on June 19, 1910. Her father was the Civil War veteran William Jackson Smart. He was a single parent who raised his six children there. After hearing a sermon about Anna Jarvis on Mother's Day at Central Methodist Episcopal Church in 1909, Sonora told her pastor that fathers should have a similar holiday honoring them. Although she initially suggested June 5, her father's birthday, the pastors of the Spokane Ministerial Alliance did not have enough time to prepare their sermons, and the celebration was deferred to the third Sunday of June.

In 1957, Maine Senator Margaret Chase Smith wrote a proposal accusing Congress of ignoring fathers for 40 years while honoring mothers, thus, "[singling] out just one of our two parents." In 1966, President Lyndon B. Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, designating the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. Six years later, the day was made a permanent national holiday when President Richard Nixon signed it into law in 1972.

Thank God someone decided to do the right thing to honor the two most important people in our lives before our spouse and children come along. They should be at the top of the list or should be forever.

This was a great thing that took the efforts of some dedicated folks to give the us both of these annual celebrations. However, the proclamation for this was written a long time ago by the hand of God.

Exodus 20:12

Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the LORD your God is giving you.

Music: As we move forward into the summer, we are continuing with the early service inside with a small choir and the later service outside with more of the choir. There is usually a small orchestra group that plays the pre-service music at the outside service. This month I thought I would share some thoughts about music, specifically

hymns. I have always said that the words are so very important in the hymns, and even if you don't sing, you should read the words. Over the years, when I would visit another church, I tended to take a little time to look through the hymn book. With the Bible being first, the hymnal is a very important aid to the worship service. I recently read a thought by a publisher of hymn stories that said; "Hymns are a rich deposit of Christian devotion, echoing the adoration of Heaven and uplifting the faithful on earth who make their discovery." He also suggested a few simple suggestions. The next time you open your church hymnal (or look at the copy of the words in the bulletin) to lift your voice in praise and take a few extra moments to note thoughtfully the words you sing. Make an effort to learn something about the inspiration for the writing of the hymn. The hymnal can also be an aid to one's own daily personal devotional life.

I was a typical boomer and did not realize my dad was a genius and my mom was a saint until after they had gone to be with God. Don't make that mistake. Stop what you are doing and take the time to listen. They have libraries of knowledge. Honor them every day before its too late. They have remedies for what ails you that work, FDA approved or not. All Nations' Café for International J1 Students

The All Nations' Cafe for the J1 students will begin on June 15th. The Dot Jordan Circle from Trinity graciously agreed to provide dinner. We have around 20 to 25 students in the NMB area at present, who are working at Wal-Mart plus a second job. We cannot really predict how many we will have. This feels like our first cafe night four years ago. After the first two hours, we did not think we were going to have any students. Then several students ended up being 65 each Tuesday night by our second year.

We are hoping that students will learn about our culture, our people and our belief and faith in God. Some are already Christians, but many are Muslims, Hindu and others. They learn this through our volunteers, plus they teach us many things.

On Wednesdays outings are being planned, such as a trip to Charleston, boat excursions, Huntington State Park, Market Commons, etc. We will need volunteers for transportation if you are interested in helping.

The airport is still on hold. The airport does not want one-on-one contact but they do want people there to meet the students! So we do not know exactly how this will happen although this is a very important part of this mission.

The bike rental program has been our biggest challenge. Our supply has been sitting for the past year, developing problems. We have asked for help to work on the bikes, but at this point we would appreciate any donations, used bikes, new bikes, or donations toward buying new bikes.
