A Pastor's Ponderings

STATE OF THE CHURCH REPORT

It is that time again, the State of the Church Report from the pastor. Where do we stand? How are we doing with our Prayers, our Presence, our Gifts, our Service, and our Witness? Mission Ministry News November 2020

Reverse Advent Calendar! Here is a spin on the normal Advent Calendar. Instead of receiving you would be giving. Each day from December 1st through December 24 place a different food item in a box. After Christmas bring that box to the church where it will be used by ASAP to help feed veterans in need and help to stock the food pantry. You will find a suggested list of items on page 3 of the Newsletter, but any food items would be appreciated.

If you have any **2021 calendars** that you do not want, please bring them to the church. We will distribute them at the November ASAP food distribution.

On November 18 and 19 from 9:00 am-1:00 pm, **Support Military Spouses** will be holding a Christmas Care Package assembly gathering at the Myrtle Beach Mall. Tables will be six feet apart, and you must wear a mask. This organization puts together care packages for military spouses and children. They are then delivered and passed out at some of the military bases in South and North Carolina. Several of our church members have helped with this before, and Jackie Stanley and I have driven the trucks on several occasions. If you would like to help, please register at supportmilitaryfamilies.org.

The Veterans Welcome Home and Resource Center is in need of volunteers. This is office-type work with no heavy lifting required. If you are interested, please call the center at 843-427-4568.

On October 7th, I delivered 618 pairs of socks to several veterans and homeless organizations in the Myrtle Beach area. Since then, I have received an additional 177 pair. I would like to thank all who donated. As always you came through to help support those in need. I would also like to thank the anonymous person/persons who had 640 pairs of socks shipped to us. I will be delivering these soon. As we go into the colder months, new, warm socks are essential to helping the veterans/homeless stay warm and as healthy as possible.

Angel Tree will be coming in late November/early December. Please plan to support this ministry by taking one or more names and providing these children with a Merry Christmas.

ASAP is still going strong. We are currently serving 64 veterans. All food donations are welcome, but jelly and canned fruit are the most needed at this time. Anything you bring will be given to the veterans. Of course, we will happily accept monetary donations as well.

Mobile Meal Dates for the remainder of 2020. December 28 - January 1.

Master's Meal – Master's Meal is not operating in the “old normal” fashion, but we are in business. In October we started feeding hot meals again. If the weather is good, they can sit outside and eat or if the weather is bad, they will get a hot meal to take home. I would like to thank Edward Klein for his help. He has been very active in preparing and distributing meals, especially during the recent months. Linda have created bags of food and toiletries so they can have them readily available if someone comes to the door asking for food. For these bags, we need food with **pop top lids and small sized toiletry items**. Many of our usual volunteers are not able to help because of Covid-19. **If you are interested in helping with this mission, please contact Linda Jones at 864-680-3994.**

American Flags – If you have an old or tattered American flag that needs to be disposed of properly, you can drop it off at the church.

Pop-Tops - We are still collecting aluminum pop-tops. We don't get much for them, but what we do get is donated to the Ronald McDonald House. If you want to help, start saving the pop-tops, and every few months bring them to the church and leave for Frank Autry. Thanks to those who have been leaving them for me.

All **Mission** and **ASAP** meetings have been cancelled for the remainder of 2020.

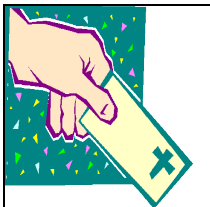

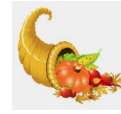

Guidelines for Trinity Church Services:

Please – If you do not feel well, please stay home and enjoy the service streaming online.

The Ushers/Security Team will be responsible for insuring social distancing!

We prefer and encourage that we take care of each other and wear a mask. If you do not have one, we will provide one.

In the event of rain both services will be held inside.

8:30 am Traditional Service This service will be held inside the Sanctuary.

- *Church doors will open at 8:00 am. This service will be held in the sanctuary (including the balcony) and will accommodate about 45 families. We prefer that we take care of each other and wear a mask. If you do not have one, we will provide one.
- *Please enter through the Narthex doors. The rear doors will remain locked.
- *Attendees will be seated by the ushers, starting at the front of the sanctuary in order to maintain social distancing.
- *Social distancing is measured by sitting on the positioned cushions on each pew. Some chairs in the balcony have been taped off to aid in social distancing.
- *Some overflow will be seated in the Fellowship Hall as long as social distancing can be maintained. Audio and video will be available in the Fellowship Hall.
- *Singing in the Sanctuary will be possible with everyone wearing a mask.
- *This service will also be available on FM 102.1 if you want to sit in your car.
- *Hymnals and all other material on the back of pews have been removed.
- *Offering plates will not be passed but will be offered to each family by an usher.
- *After service, attendees will please remain in the pews until dismissed by the ushers. Please maintain social distancing before, during and after the services.
- *Bathrooms in the Narthex and by the back door will be available. All others will be locked.
- *On Communion Sundays, prepackaged juice and wafer will be used.
- *A service will be live streamed and archived for watching at a later time.

11:00 - Encounter Service - Contemporary

- *This service will continue to be recorded and available online.

11:00 am - Traditional Service This service will be held outside.

- *The pastor will set up in front of the **Fellowship Hall doors**.
- *In the event of rain, the service will be moved inside the Church, and you will be asked to wear your mask. Singing in the Sanctuary will be possible with everyone wearing a mask. **Please see guidelines above for service inside.**
- *Worshippers may bring chairs to sit on the lawn (No chairs will be taken from inside the church) or remain in their cars and tune in to FM radio (frequency 102.1).

- *Ushers will carry buckets to each car that is occupied during the offering and to those sitting on the lawn. Ushers will wear face masks and gloves while doing this.
- *On Communion Sundays a prepackaged juice and wafer will be delivered to each car and anyone sitting on the lawn.
