Libby is a valued support worker of Connections Plus.

Not only does Libby provide support in our local community for seventeen years Libby has been volunteering in Kwazulu-Natal, Africa.

Kwazulu-Natal is a coastal South African province.

Libby has recently returned from her seventeenth trip to Africa, in 2005 Libby decided to set off to Africa to Volunteer at an aids orphanage for 12 months. Libby fell in love with the people of Kwazulu-Natal, so every year Libby returns to the same community to volunteer in a number of ways.

Kwazulu-Natal is an extremely disadvantaged community, where 75% of adults are unemployed.

Libby's work involves setting up and establishing vegetable gardens, purchasing school uniforms and shoes, providing books for the local schools, providing emergency food supplies, and providing training in

a acquired skills in carpentry, welding, sewing and computers.

These people are underprivileged and poor, but they are resilient, creative and resourceful, and most importantly they never lose their sense of hope. Despite their circumstances and daily challenges, they are amongst the happiest people in the world.

They are truly inspiring, and have taught Libby so much over the years.

Thank you for sharing your master pieces with us ladies!




















