

THE WOODLOCH TOWN COUNCIL HELD A SPECIAL AGENDA MEETING ON FRIDAY JULY 3, 2021.  
Meeting started at 11:02 am @ 15859 Needham Rd (Water Plant)

1. Call to Order by Mayor Leino
2. Opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America was led by Mayor Leino
3. Roll Call Present at the meeting were:  
Mayor, R. Leino Jr., Aldermen: G. Mink (ran a little late), C. Waddle, L. Kessner, M. Greening, and Donald J. Nichols. Quorum was established.
4. Citizen Comments – Not to Exceed 30 minutes (3 minutes per person) No comments on this meeting.
5. Presentation of current, past, and future projects relating to the Sewer Treatment Plant. Jason started the presentation by stating that they were at the Water Plant and proceeded to show the council members the water plant and the process. He showed them well #1 and stated that this well produces about 160 gallons per minute. Well #2 produces 130 gallons per minute. In the last five years, well #2 has had work done to it. Well #1 has a hole in the casing, but haven't found exactly where it is or the what size but as of now it hasn't gotten worse and they test it often. Jason stated that they do an annual well production test as well as well as a vibration test. The well is about 160-180 feet. What you see in the clear tubes there contains phosphates which helps with corrosion control as we have a bunch of galvanize pipes in the neighborhood. It also puts a protective coat on iron to prevent red water. We do not have any quality issues because of it. Sometimes we do get a little bit of odor because we do not have a way to air it out. Mayor intercepted letting the council members know that in the future, there is a plan to apply for a grant to fix issues at this well. Jason proceeded to explain the process of pumping the water out of the ground and treated and stored in the Brown tank. There are screens to let air go in and it prevents bugs to go in. Jason walked everyone to the back-up generator tank when power is out and it will run for almost two days on a tank of diesel. There is back up pumps in case one or two fail. Jason proceeded to show the council members the way the wells work and showed them the control room and how it works. Mike talked about the possibility to build a new control room as well much better improved once the grants are secured.

They plan to drive by the lift station to show the council members.
