## *The State of Sherwood Forest*



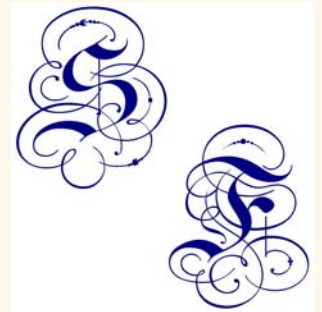
The state of Sherwood Forest is alive and doing better than most realize. Our security is getting stronger and property values are growing. People still want to move into Sherwood Forest and make it their home. Before Katrina there was about a 6% increase on house sales and that spiked to 15% right after the storm. Now the sales have calmed down but are back at about 6% again. In January we had 7 homes to sell, in February there was

9 and in March there has been 5 with 7 more pending. SFCA has obtained architectural control of many of the filings (and more on the way) making it easier to maintain building restrictions and enforce city ordinances. To keep our homes safe and property values healthy we have to remind those that are new in our area and stay vigilant of those that ignore the laws. Crime is a constant threat growing as Greater Baton Rouge increases in population from areas where it thrived. We have better police staffing and new crime prevention strategies to maintain control. There is new

emphasis on Neighborhood Watch programs and close relationships with the associations and law enforcement to overcome our weaknesses. There has never been a more exciting time to watch our city and communities grow in strength. Roads are getting better and transportation of the new population is flowing. Old Hammond Highway, Siegen Lane, Airline Highway and under way is Harrell's Ferry Road two-lane curb and gutter roadway that will include a continuous center turn lane from East Old Hammond Hwy to Sherwood Forest Blvd. The Green Light efforts have implemented an enhanced intersection we so desperately needed at the



I-12 intersection as well as at South Sherwood Forest and Airline. I am proud to say that I live in Sherwood Forest and that pride is what drives us all to make our homes the best it can be. Things are looking better indeed.



## *Real Estate News from your neighborhood expert!*

We have all been warned "don't judge a book by its cover." But people do it all the time. Whether you are in the market to sell your home or not, it is very important to keep property values up; after all "first impressions are lasting impressions." You only get one chance to make a first impression! "An investment of as little as a few hundred dollars can make a huge difference in the appearance of your home. Here are 8 simple but effective suggestions:

**Spruce up Curb Appeal:** Condition of the landscaping, paint, roof, shutters, front door, knocker, windows, house number, and even how window treatments look from the outside. Add something special — such as big flower pot or an antique bench. Trim bushes to below window height.

**Enrich with color:** Paint is cheap so remember if you are thinking about selling your home keep colors neutral. You want to depersonalize as much as possible. If you must have color, I recommend soft colors that say "welcome." Lead the eye from room to room, and flatter skin tones. Think soft yellows and pale greens. Tint ceilings a lighter shade. Put a fresh coat of paint on siding, downspouts, and doors.

**Clean out, organize closets:** Get sorting — organize your piles into "don't need," "haven't worn," and "keep." Pare down clutter and pack up your least-used items, such as out-of-season clothes.

**Wash:** windows and replace any cracked or broken ones

**A/C Unit:** Improve energy efficiency by vacuuming grates, coils,

and condensers in your A/C, furnace, stove, and refrigerator (either underneath or in back). If a vacuum won't reach, try a rag tied to a yardstick.

**Wash the walls:** Grease, smoke, and dust can adhere to walls and make even the best decorating look dingy. Wash walls using a general-purpose cleaner with hot water. Start at the top of the wall (to avoid drips) and in a corner (so that you wash one wall at a time). Rinse the mop head frequently in clean water and don't press too hard because flat latex paint won't absorb too much water.

**Driveway and walks:** Fill cracks in the driveway and walks.

**Floors:** shampoo carpeted floors, polyurethane wood ones and keep ceramic tile clean.

## Florida Overlay Project - Councilwoman Martha Jane Tassin



**"Be kinder than necessary, for everyone you meet is fighting some kind of battle."**

*The \$25 dues for the 2008 membership to Sherwood Forest Citizens Association are now due and we depend on those to operate our non-profit efforts in your community. Security patrols have increased, the signs and gardens are looking good, newsletter frequency could increase, website information is there for you, legal needs are cared for...*

In the summer of 2006, a committee was formed to create the Florida Boulevard Urban Design Overlay District. This committee began meeting in August and met monthly, completing its goal in January of this year. The purpose of the overlay district is "to provide guidelines for development and redevelopment activity along Florida Blvd. from North Foster Drive to Flannery Road and to strengthen the physical and economic character of the neighborhood by mitigating or avoiding incompatible land uses in development and redevelopment." Lighting, signage, parking requirements, fencing requirements, exterior building materials, landscape/buffer requirements and service areas are the

main areas of focus in this district. All existing developments must come into compliance if there is a change of permitted use, change of occupancy, an addition resulting in a 30 percent or more increase of square footage, or a renovation that involves 30 percent or more of the gross floor area. Additionally, non-conforming signs must be brought into compliance if modifications are made or if damage occurs to an existing sign. Chain link, barbed wire, or razor wire on any lot which fronts Florida Blvd. and is visible from Florida Blvd. must be removed within 60 days of adoption of the ordinance. The entire ordinance may be viewed at the City-Parish Planning Commis-

## *Daylight Savings Time...Did You Know...?*



Standard time (time zones) in the U.S. & Canada was instituted by the railroads in 1883. The Standard Time Act established it into law on March 19, 1918. The act also established daylight saving time. In 1919 daylight savings time was repealed. It was reestablished nationally during World War II and was continuously observed from February 9, 1942 to September

30, 1945.

The Uniform Time Act of 1966 established standardization in the dates of beginning and end of daylight time in the U.S. but allowed for local exemptions from its observance. Congress enacted earlier starting dates of daylight time during the "energy crisis" years. Several changes of the beginning and ending dates of daylight time occurred over the years.

The Energy Policy Act of 2005 changed both the starting and ending dates.

Beginning in 2007, daylight savings time started on the second Sunday in March and ended on the first Sunday in November. In 2008 daylight

savings time began on March 9<sup>th</sup> and ends on November 2<sup>nd</sup>. And next year, 2009 the dates are March 8, 2009 and ends on November 1, 2009.

Not all states observe daylight savings time. States such as Hawaii and most of Arizona do not use it. Indiana adopted its use beginning in 2006.

Other countries observe some form of "summer time", but they do not necessarily change their clocks on the same date as the U.S.

## *Federation of Greater Baton Rouge Civic Associations ..... What is that?*

**Sherwood Forest Civic Association** is a member of the Federation of Greater Baton Rouge Civic Associations.

**The Federation was formed in the early 1970's** as an umbrella organization of member homeowner associations throughout East Baton Rouge Parish. This was the first organization of its kind in the United States and the idea has spread in recent years to other areas of the country. The Federation is a volunteer driven 501(C) (3) organization that has helped to improve the quality of life of the citizens of East Baton Rouge Parish through education and representation for over 30 years. As community needs have grown and changed, and where such opportunities exist, the Federation has succeeded in establishing relationships and partnerships with other organizations to accomplish specific goals, all to the betterment of East Baton Rouge Parish. Out careful utilization of limited financial and volunteer resources has allowed the Federation to continue to achieve its mission into its fourth decade of existence.

**The FGBRCA is comprised of dues paying neighborhood homeowner associations** and represents the interest of East Baton Rouge Parish residents on issues that affect the citizens and their neighborhoods. The Federation monitors zoning throughout East Baton Rouge Parish and seeks to maintain the character and integrity of the various neighborhoods. It serves in matters, streets and drainage, sewer, police protection and city planning. The Federation conducts and participates in forums designed to educate the citizenry about matters of common interest. The Federation also communicates the needs

and concerns of the individual neighborhoods to local government officials and assists those neighborhoods in problem resolution.

**The Federation helps individual neighborhood homeowner associations organize** for the benefit of their communities. It provides assistance, speakers, advice, contracts and literature to these neighborhood associations in their effort to maintain and improve the quality of life in their areas. The Federation conducts forums in which the member organizations can share their experiences regarding neighborhood activities, social events, and neighborhood improvement or beautification projects. The Federation conducts forums where the members hear discussions on City/Parish issues of public interest and listen to views of candidates running for public office. It provides a monthly forum for discussion and solutions of problems that can affect all neighborhoods, including deed restrictions and violations, zoning, neighborhood security, drainage, noise, organization and by-laws, corporation annual reports, legal proceedings, etc. It provides advice and assistance to member organizations on issues such as planning and zoning procedures. The Federation provides a Resource Center with information on community issues important to its membership, such as grants and smart growth.

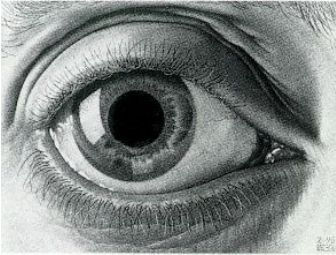
**Members of the Federation serve on numerous committees** working with the Mayor's Office, the Planning and Zoning Commission, the Metro-Council, the City-Parish Planning Office, the Baton Rouge Police Department and the Sheriff's Office. The Federation was instrumental in the original development of the Comprehensive Land Use Plan, which subse-

quently became known as the Horizon Plan and was passed on by vote of the citizens of East Baton Rouge Parish. The Federation was instrumental in and provided funding for televising of Planning and Zoning Commission meetings. Federation representatives participated in the rewrite of the Uniform Development Code, and development of the Billboard Ordinance, the Portable Storage Building Ordinance and the Landscape Ordinance. Representatives of the Federation serve, both past and present, on Metro-1, Metro-3, and Metro-9, the Tree and Landscape Commission, the Crime Prevention Housing Coalition, the LSU Campus-Community Coalition for Change, the Sanitary Sewer Citizens Advisory Committee, Smart Growth, CAN DO, the City-Parish Zoning Committee, the Central Community Alliance, the Litter Prevention Coalition, the Traffic Impact Fee Task Force, and the Bicycle Pedestrian Plan Advisory committee, among others. Federation representatives are providing input on development of a new lighting ordinance and a new zoning notification ordinance. During major election years, the Federation sponsors community-wide candidate forums to educate the public on views and issues important to the electorate. The Federation participates in and provides speakers for various educational seminars and forums on a multitude of community issues. The Federation participates in various community and member organization social events, to include the Kenilworth 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade. The Federation continues to collaborate and partner with other community organizations in achieving common goals for the betterment of the community.

**OOPS.** There have been complaints about grass clippings being blown into the street. It can be unsightly and littering or disposing of trash into the City/Parish sewer system (for example, through a storm drain) is a violation of City/Parish law. Let your lawn service know.

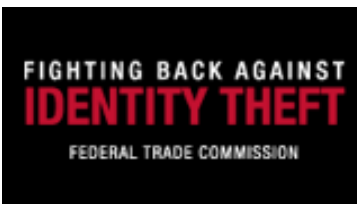


**OOPS...DID YOU REALIZE...**

# IDENTITY THEFT

**I Had No Idea! Most People Don't ...** by Jeanne Moreland Trum



*10 percent of all victims spent at least 55 hours resolving their problems. The top 5 percent of victims spent at least 130 hours.*

**Who is at risk of IDT?** If you answer yes to any of the following questions, then you guessed it...**you ARE at risk:**

What can I do to minimize my risk? Where do I start when/if I am a victim? These questions, among others are common among concerned consumers. So don't feel bad if you have questions. You should. Choose to become educated.

**Consider these questions:**

- Have a name, birthday, social security number?
- Between the ages of 0-125?
- Have and address, driver's license, professional license?
- Had a job, student loan, owned a business, filed tax returns?
- Have life, health, automobile, homeowners insurance?
- A driving, criminal, health record?

I was beginning to get the picture. No matter how careful I was with my personal information that there was no way to keep track or control the information connected to my identity.

The fact is any person who answers "Yes" to any of the above questions has had their information collected, disseminated and sold many times over. So when we consumers are notified of data breaches within large or small companies and/or government entities such as *Choice Point, MasterCard, AOL, Veterans Administration, State of Louisiana's Board of Regents, Roman's Café*, to name a few, we should be seriously concerned.

Most importantly, I learned that IDT is more than a financial issue - more than my *FICO* score. There are 5 major areas of identity theft and the victims are ultimately responsible to clear their names.

A recent study from the *Identity Theft Resource Center* focused exclusively on *IDT*, found that victims can expect

on average to log on 600 hours recovering from this crime.\*

**The 5 major areas of identity theft ...**

**1. Driver's License IDT** – If you have a good driving record that could change. Insurance rates could go up. If tickets go unpaid, because you don't know about them, and you don't show up in court on "your" appointed date, a bench warrant could be in your future.

**2. Social Security IDT** – A friend of mine who lives and works in Louisiana received a letter from the IRS demanding \$20,000 in taxes for \$80,000 in income over what she reported. "Her" extra income was made in Texas.

**3. Medical IDT** - Imagine sending in an insurance claim to your health insurance carrier and it is denied because "you" have already maxed out "your" benefits for the year. A victim's rates could go up or even cancelled. Try obtaining medical, life insurance and/or employment because

of conditions that “the other you” might be reporting!

**4. Character IDT** – A victim could be arrested or denied employment because of fraudulent criminal records found during background checks, security checkpoints could become a nightmare, or even denial of a passport or free travel in and out of the country.

**5. Financial IDT** - This is most commonly advertised but is only about 26% of the problem. Another myth about financial IDT is that a victim is not ever liable. That is absolutely false. Read the fine print. Order the **Federal Trade Commission** free report, *Take Charge: Fighting Back Against Identity Theft*. [www.consumer.gov/](http://www.consumer.gov/)

idthetexcerpt from the report states:

“... *the Fair Credit Billing Act establishes procedures for resolving billing errors on your credit...accounts...To take advantage of the law’s consumer protection, you must:....send your letter so that it reaches the creditor within 60 days. If an identity thief changes the address on your account and you didn’t receive the bill, your dispute letter still must reach the creditor within 60 days of when the creditor would have mailed the bill*” (pg.19).

The intent of this article is to inform and educate, not scare, even though IDT by its very nature is scary. I hope this information has created a greater respect for your personal information and a greater awareness

of how this growing crime can affect your life and the lives of your loved ones.

## Neighborhood Watch—Ways to Help Protect Your Home

Exterior lighting is extremely important in residential security. Each exterior doorway should be lighted to prevent a burglar from concealing his activities. Yards and areas around windows should be lighted to prevent concealment. A number of ornamental porch lights and lamp post lights are available which can help eliminate night blind spots.

Yard lights and entrance lights can be equipped with

sensors which will turn the light on at dusk and off at dawn. Motion sensor lighting can also be installed that will activate when a person walks past or some other movement takes place.

To give the appearance that you are at home, use an electric timer to turn lamps on in the evening and off at your normal retirement hour.

Timers can be used to turn on radios as well as lamps.

Use at least one timer on each floor of the house.

A sliding glass door is lifted into position when installed and, therefore, can be lifted from the track to be removed by a burglar. To prevent this, it is recommended that two or three sheet metal screws be inserted into the track above the sliding door. These screws should be adjusted so that the top of the door barely clears them when it is operated.

The best lock for a sliding

glass door is a deadlock, which utilizes a bore pin tumbler cylinder and is operable by a key from the outside. The lock bolt should engage the strike sufficiently so that it will not be disengaged by any amount of movement. When the existing inside pull has to be changed in order to accommodate a new deadlock, an inside cylinder pull is recommended as a replacement.

## Helpful Hints by Mike Walker

During the 7 plus years I've been your District 8 Councilman, hundreds of calls covering a wide variety of subjects have been received in my office from Sherwood Forest residents. Some of the items we're most frequently asked about include:



**Animals:**  
Dogs and cats must be leashed or kenneled whenever outside their confinements;

in some residential zoning designations, a property owner is allowed to have 3 hens but no roosters (yes, we do often get complaints about roosters awaking folks at dawn!). Remember this is a city ordinance so be sure to check your deed restrictions.



**Residential:**

In residential areas, you can have a business "in" your home, but it can't be obvious

that you're running a business "out" of your home (no outside advertising and no undue amount of vehicles); there are restrictions on how tall grass can be; there are also restrictions on "debris" on private property; whenever a property owner wants to make outside changes (erect a small building, lay a drive, add on to house, etc.) the City-Parish Permit Office should be consulted and/or Neighborhood Deed Restrictions should be reviewed; if a contractor is hired to fell trees, it is the contractor's responsibility to remove the debris, and the city-parish nor the waste collection company is required to do such removal (there are some contractors who have been known to tell residents otherwise, so be careful).

**Vehicles:**  
Regardless of where a vehicle is parked, if determined to be



"abandoned" by an investigating Baton Rouge police officer or Sheriff's deputy, the vehicle may be towed after proper notification; in Sherwood Forest, vehicles cannot be parked on the grass **in the front yard.**

- Never leave doors or windows unlocked when leaving home
- Display only your last name on your nameplate or mailbox
