- Mechanical Leader

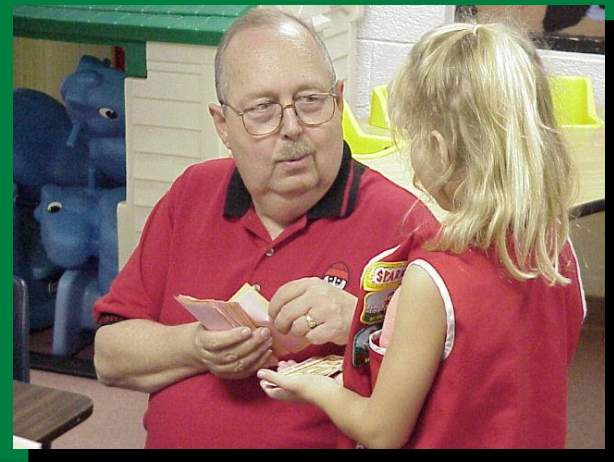


- Meet obligations, but heart is not a part of their motivation.
