#### **SERMON: REMEMBER**

# Luke 22:19-20

(19) And He took bread, and gave thanks, and brake it, and gave unto them, saying, This is My body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of me. (20) Likewise also the cup after supper, saying, This cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you.

#### Introduction

One of the most profound parts of our being, as humans, is our memory. Memory aids in our ability to think and to reason. Athletes, musicians, and ballerinas, just to name a few, know that not only our brains, but also the muscles of our fingers, arms, and legs have memory.
