

SERMON: A VISIT TO CALVARY

Luke 23:33

And when they came to the place, which is called Calvary, there they crucified Him, and the malefactors, one on the right hand, and the other on the left.

Introduction

As Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper, He instructed His disciples with these words, "As often as ye do this, ye do it in remembrance of Me." By these words, Jesus was telling His followers to visit Calvary often with their "sanctified imagination."

Many Christians would like to visit the Holy Land and actually walk where our Lord walked. Some will experience this joy, but the majority will never be able to visit Jerusalem, except by inspired imagination. There are so many pleasant sites in the Holy Land, why would one want to visit Calvary, the scene of the most brutal injustice? Let's examine why we should visit Calvary often.
