



A READING FROM THE HEBREW BIBLE | Job 23:1-9, 16-17 (NRSVUE)

The people sit.

23 Then Job answered:

² "Today also my complaint is bitter; his hand is heavy despite my groaning. ³Oh, that I knew where I might find him, that I might come even to his dwelling! ⁴I would lay my case before him and fill my mouth with arguments. ⁵I would learn what he would answer me and understand what he would say to me. ⁶Would he contend with me in the greatness of his power? No, but he would give heed to me. ⁷ There the upright could reason with him, and I should be acquitted forever by my judge. ⁸ "If I go forward, he is not there; or backward, I cannot perceive him; ⁹ on the left he hides, and I cannot behold him; I turn to the right, but I cannot see him. ¹⁶ God has made my heart faint; the Almighty has terrified me.

PSALM 22 | 1-15 Book of Common Prayer Remain seated. The Psalm is read responsively.

- 1 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? and are so far from my cry and from the words of my distress?
- 2 O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not answer; by night as well, but I find no rest.
- 3 Yet you are the Holy One, enthroned upon the praises of Israel.
- 4 Our forefathers put their trust in you; they trusted, and you delivered them.
- 5 They cried out to you and were delivered; they trusted in you and were not put to shame.
- 6 But as for me, I am a worm and no man, scorned by all and despised by the people.
- 7 All who see me laugh me to scorn; they curl their lips and wag their heads, saying,
- 8 "He trusted in the LORD; let him deliver him; let him rescue him, if he delights in him."
- 9 Yet you are he who took me out of the womb, and kept me safe upon my mother's breast.
- 10 I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born; you were my God when I was still in my mother's womb.
- 11 Be not far from me, for trouble is near, and there is none to help.
- 12 Many young bulls encircle me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me.
- 13 They open wide their jaws at me, like a ravening and a roaring lion.
- 14 I am poured out like water; all my bones are out of joint; my heart within my breast is melting wax.
- 15 My mouth is dried out like a pot-sherd; my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; and you have laid me in the dust of the grave.

THE EPISTLE | Hebrews 4:12-16 (*NRSVUE*)

Remain seated.

¹² Indeed, the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing until it divides soul from spirit, joints from marrow; it is able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart. ¹³ And before him no creature is hidden, but all are naked and laid bare to the eyes of the one to whom we must render an account.

¹⁴Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. ¹⁵ For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. ¹⁶ Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. Amen.

THE HOLY GOSPEL | Mark 10:17-31 (NRSVUE)

Remain standing, as able.

The Holy Gospel of our Savior, Jesus Christ, according to Mark. Glory to you, O Christ.

¹⁷ As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" ¹⁸ Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. ¹⁹ You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness. You shall not defraud. Honor your father and mother.' " ²⁰ He said to him, "Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth." ²¹ Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." ²² When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

²³ Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" ²⁴ And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! ²⁵ It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." ²⁶ They were greatly astounded and said to one another, "Then who can be saved?" ²⁷ Jesus looked at them and said, "For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible."

²⁸ Peter began to say to him, "Look, we have left everything and followed you." ²⁹ Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields for my sake and for the sake of the good news ³⁰ who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. ³¹ But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first."

EL SANTO EVANGELIO | Mark 10:17-31 (Dios Habla Hoy)

¹⁷ Cuando Jesús iba a seguir su viaje, llegó un hombre corriendo, se puso de rodillas delante de él y le preguntó: "Maestro bueno, ¿qué debo hacer para alcanzar la vida eterna?" ¹⁸ Jesús le contestó: "¿Por qué me llamas bueno? Bueno solamente hay uno: Dios. ¹⁹ Ya sabes los mandamientos: "No mates, no cometas adulterio, no robes, no digas mentiras en perjuicio de nadie ni engañes; honra a tu padre y a tu madre." ²⁰ El hombre le dijo: "Maestro, todo eso lo he cumplido desde joven. ²¹ Jesús lo miró con cariño, y le contestó: "Una cosa te falta: anda, vende todo lo que tienes y dáselo a los pobres. ²³ Jesús miró entonces alrededor, y dijo a sus discípulos: ¡Qué difícil va a ser para los ricos entrar en el reino de Dios! ²⁴ Estas palabras dejaron asombrados a los discípulos, pero Jesús les volvió a decir: —Hijos, ¡qué difícil es entrar en el reino de Dios! ²⁵ Es más fácil para un camello pasar por el ojo de una aguja, que para un rico entrar en el reino de Dios. ²⁶ Al oírlo, se asombraron más aún, y se preguntaban unos a otros: "¿Y quién podrá salvarse? ²⁷ Jesús los miró y les contestó: "Para los hombres es imposible, pero no para Dios, porque para él todo es posible."

THE SERMON | The Rev. Dr. Janet Waggoner

A STATEMENT OF FAITH BASED ON GALATIANS 3:26-28 *All stand, as able.*

Celebrant Let us renew our pledge to work for unity, justice, and peace.

People We are all children of God. There is no longer Jew or Greek. There is no longer slave or free. There is no longer male and female. For we are all one.
We believe Jesus lived for this and died for this.
We pledge ourselves with God's help and the support of each other to make this become a reality.

THE NICENE CREED

All remain standing, as able.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: was incarnate by the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE –

All stand, or kneel, as able. The Deacon, if present, bids the prayers.

We are the adopted sons and daughters of the Risen One, to whom we offer our prayers and petitions, responding, "Hear us, O Spirit of Truth."

Rock of our Salvation, help us to identify those things that keep us from following you with our whole heart and mind and soul, and give us the courage to do what you ask; for this we pray. **Hear us, O Spirit of Truth.**

Crucified One, in your selfless love you gave your life that we might have life abundant; infuse us with a deep sense of gratitude, that we may be generous in our giving towards the work of your Church, your outward and visible presence in the world today; for this we pray. **Hear us, O Spirit of Truth.**

Defender of orphans and widows, be with children who have no mother or father, with women who have lost husbands and sons on the field of battle, that agencies for support and counsel will give them an opportunity for healing and new life; for this we pray. **Hear us, O Spirit of Truth.**

Good Shepherd, search for us who randomly fall into the snares of sin, seek us when we are deaf to your call and swallowed up by our pride and self-interests, and show us the way of return and forgiveness; for this we pray. **Hear us, O Spirit of Truth.**

Author of peace, free the world from the struggles for power and supremacy, that we may lay down weapons of destruction and raise up those things which provide for the education, health, and security of the global community; for this we pray. **Hear us, O Spirit of Truth.**

Risen Christ, raise the dead who have departed this life in faith, and judge with mercy those who turned from your face; for this we pray. **Hear us, O Spirit of Truth.**

In companionship with Mary, the blessed mother of Jesus, and all the saints, we continue our prayers.

In the Anglican Cycle of Prayer, we pray this week for The Episcopal Church in the Philippines.

In our Diocesan Cycle of Prayer, we pray this week for Christ Church, Seattle; and St. Andrew's, Seattle.

The Celebrant adds a concluding Collect.

Jesus Christ, you said to your apostles, "Peace I give to you; my own peace I leave with you:" Regard not our sins, but the faith of your Church, and give to us the peace and unity of that heavenly City, where with the Almighty and the Holy Spirit, you live and reign, now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE CONFESSION

The Deacon, if present, bids the confession.

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Silence may be kept.

Minister and People

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

The priest says

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

THE PEACE

All stand, as able.

The peace of Christ be always with you. And also with you.

Then the Ministers and the People may greet one another in the name of Christ.

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND THANKSGIVINGS

Please be seated for the announcements and thanksgivings.

BIRTHDAY PRAYER

Watch over your *child/children*, O God, as their days increase; bless and guide them wherever they may be. Strengthen them when they stand; comfort them when discouraged or sorrowful; raise them up if they fall; and in their heart may your peace which passes understanding abide all the days of their life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

ANNIVERSARY PRAYER

O God, you have so consecrated the covenant of marriage that in it is represented the spiritual unity between Christ and his Church: Send therefore your blessing upon these your servants, that they may continue to so love, honor, and cherish each other in faithfulness and patience, in wisdom and true godliness, that their home may continue to be a haven of blessing and peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.


THE INVITATION

This is the table, not of the church but of Jesus Christ. It is made ready for those who love Jesus and who want to love him more. Come, you who have much faith and you who have little; you who have been here often and you who have not been for a long time or ever before. Come, you who have tried to follow and you who have failed. Come, not because the Church invites you; it is Christ, and he invites you to meet him here. (From the Iona Community, adapted)

All are invited and encouraged to come forward to receive communion or a blessing. To receive the bread, extend your hands and a piece of bread will be placed in your palm. (Gluten-free bread is available. Just say, "gluten-free".) To receive the wine, help the chalice bearer guide the chalice to your lips and sip. To maintain health and safety, we ask that bread not be dipped into the chalice. To receive a blessing, please cross your arms across your chest, and the priest will bless you.


Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.


THE BLESSING

LANGUAGE SHARING – Our new ESL program is up and running. Many English-speakers have expressed interest in learning Spanish, and many remember fondly the Gospel being read in worship in Khmer when St. John's was working with the Cambodian refugees. To deepen our St. John | San Juan connections, the Gospel and the Lord's Prayer will be printed in our bulletin in Spanish, as well as in English. Please engage in the Gospel lesson and say the Lord's Prayer in the language of your heart (or the language your heart is learning!).


