FROM THE PASTOR, TERRY JOHNSTON

³¹ He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. ³² Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches."

Matthew 13:31-32

One of the repeating themes of the Bible is how God takes something small, even something insignificant, and does great things with his power. Story after story reminds us of God's faithfulness to produce surprising results. As we recently studied in one of our Sunday school lessons, we talked about how our own hang-ups often get in the way of what it is God wants to do in us and through us.

By many measured accounts, our church is what some would call "small." We don't have some of the same luxuries that larger churches have in people or dollars. But aren't you glad that God can use "small" things to build his Kingdom in mighty ways. Our "small" church had one of the best VBS weeks we've ever had. The witness of Scripture reveals that when we are faithful with the "small" things, God takes them and blesses them in a mighty, mighty way. While there may be churches out there with more people and bigger budgets, God is still working his power through us in our "small" church. We may never be what some would call a "big" church. But that's okay with me—as long as we are doing everything we can in our "small" ways to follow the Holy Spirit in building God's Kingdom all over this world.

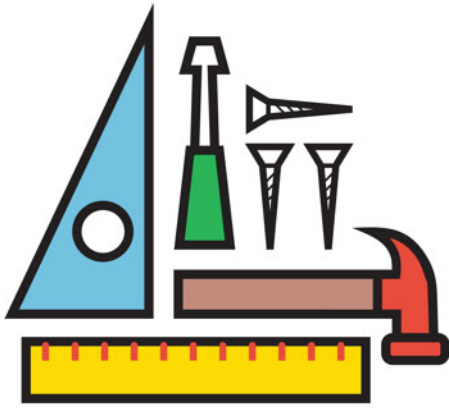
Women On Mission's next monthly meeting will be August 27th in the conference room after morning worship.

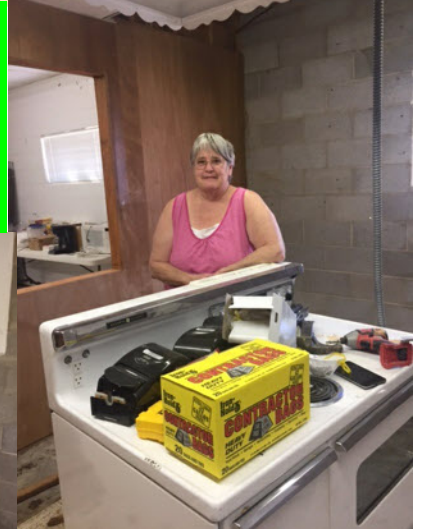
Kitchen Renovation

Jalapeno Popper Corn Fritters

2 cups corn (~4 ears)
1/2 cup flour* (or corn flour, or rice flour, etc)
1 egg
1/2 cup cheddar cheese, grated
1/4 cup cream cheese, room temperature
2+ jalapeno peppers, diced
2 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled (optional)
1 teaspoon smoked paprika
1 teaspoon coriander, toasted and ground
2 green onions, sliced
1 handful cilantro, chopped
1 lime, zest and juice
2 tablespoons oil

Mix the corn, flour, egg, cheddar cheese, cream cheese, jalapenos, bacon, paprika, coriander, green onion, cilantro and lime juice in a bowl.

Heat the oil in a pan over medium heat, form into 1/4 cup patties and cook until golden brown on both sides, about 2-4 minutes per side.

Note: Use enough flour that the mixture holds together to form patties.

Option: Top with jalapeno popper dressing.

Jalapeno Popper Dressing

1/2 cup cream cheese (light is ok), softened
1/4 cup Greek yogurt or sour cream or mayonnaise
1/4 cup buttermilk
1/4 cup fresh, pickled or roasted jalapenos
1 clove garlic
1 green onion
1 tablespoon cilantro
2 tablespoons bacon, cooked and crumbled (optional)
salt and pepper to taste

Puree everything in a food processor and optionally let sit in the fridge for a few hours.

Oreo Frozen Peanut Butter Dessert

30 OREO Cookies, finely crushed
3 Tbsp. butter, melted
1 cup creamy peanut butter
1-3/4 qt. (7 cups) vanilla ice cream, softened
1 tub (8 oz.) whipped topping (Do not thaw.)
1-1/2 pkg. (4 oz. each) Semi-Sweet Chocolate (6 oz.), broken into pieces
1/2 cup cocktail Peanuts, coarsely chopped

Combine cookie crumbs and butter; press onto bottom of 13x9-inch pan. Freeze until ready to use. Microwave peanut butter in small microwaveable bowl on HIGH 1 min.; stir. Swirl peanut butter into ice cream; spread over crust. Freeze 30 min.

Microwave whipped topping and chocolate in medium microwaveable bowl on HIGH 1-1/2 to 2 min. or until chocolate is completely melted and mixture is well blended, stirring after each minute.

Spread whipped topping mixture over ice cream layer; top with nuts. Freeze 4 hours. Remove from freezer 10 min. before serving; let stand at room temperature to soften slightly before cutting to serve.
