

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# **SCRIPTURE REFERENCE**

"The apostles said to the Lord, Show us how to *increase* our faith" (Luke 17:5 NLT)

"The apostles said to the Lord, Make our faith *greater*." (Luke 17:5 GNT)

"The apostles said to the Lord, *Increase* our faith!" (Luke 17:5 NIV)

### FAITH MYTHS

Myth #1: I don't have any faith. (Myth Buster: "...be honest in your evaluation of yourselves, measuring yourselves by the faith God has given us." Romans 12:3 NLT)

Myth #2: Faith doesn't work. (Myth Buster: "And he said to her, Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace. Your suffering is over." Mark 5:34 NLT)

Myth #3: I don't need faith to live. (Myth Buster: "For we live by faith, not by sight." 2 Corinthians 5:7 NIV)

#### **IMPORTANT REMINDER**

God <u>RESPONDS</u> to the <u>DEMONSTRATIONS</u> of our <u>FAITH!</u>

"Seeing their faith, Jesus said to the man, young man, your sins are forgiven." (Luke 5:20 NT)

"And it is impossible to please God <u>without</u> faith. Anyone who wants to come to him must believe that God exists and that he rewards those who sincerely <u>seek</u> him." (Hebrews 11:6 NLT)

#### **IMPORTANT REMINDER**

#### 1. We don't all have the same level of faith!!

"When Jesus heard this, he was amazed. Turning to the crowd that was **following** him, he said, I tell you, I haven't seen faith **like this** in all Israel." (Luke 7:9)



# TEXTUAL SIGNIFICANCE (Luke 17:1-10)

- 1. This section contains 4 units: *warning* against causing someone to stumble; a *challenge* to be forgiving; a *call* to exercise faith; *reminder* of the duties of discipleship.
- 2. The audience has now shifted back to the disciples (vs.1). The focal point with this change in audience is to alert the disciple to the *demands that come along with faith, in both a communal and individual life setting*.

### TEXTUAL HIGHLIGHTS (vs.5)

- 1. The disciples respond to Jesus' admonitions to live by a kingdom ethic with a plea that matches the high standard for their lives – "Increase our faith!"
- 2. Previously, Jesus had challenged the disciples by asking "Where is your faith?" (Luke 8:25) and their plea highlights the fact that faith is a <u>dynamic</u> process and that one can grow in their faith.
- 3. Faith is not a static event but rather a transformational journey!!

# TEXTUAL HIGHLIGHTS (vs.5)


- 4. They ask Jesus to add to OR strengthen their faith because they recognize that *faith is not just a matter of their own strength*.
- 5. Jesus responds by *redefining* their understanding of faith they sought MORE faith in order to live up to the expectations placed upon them.
- 6. Jesus shatters their illusions about faith by saying *they* don't need MORE faith but understand that faith enables God to work in a person's life that defy ordinary human experiences. (Vs.6)

#### **KEY TAKEAWAYS**

- 1. Jesus assures the disciples that even with a *LITTLE* faith they can live by his teachings on discipleship!
- 2. The disciple can do what God *REQUIRES* through faith but the disciple can never do MORE than is required.
